



Nazareth College Psychologist Listed In Lecture Series

Vera D. Denty, member of the British Psychological Society, the National Association for Mental Health and the American Catholic Psychological Association, will be at Nazareth College for a series of lectures on Feb. 13 and 14. Miss Denty will address the student body on "Love as a Social Force" on Thursday, Feb. 13 at 2:15 p.m.

At the 10:35 period on the same day Miss Denty will speak to the Freshmen and Juniors on "Psychological Aids to Study" and on the following day, Friday, the 14th at 11:30 a.m. she will address the Seniors and Sophomores on "Psychology in the Development of Personality."

MISS DENTY did both her undergraduate and graduate work in psychology and completed her psychoanalytical training under the late Professor J. C. Flugel at London University. She finished her training just as war broke out and was plunged into intensive work at the London child guidance clinic in the training of Child Development Students. She also conducted psychology courses for parishioners in one of London's leading parishes.

The Junior Class of Nazareth College received their college rings in a formal ceremony at the Student Hall, yesterday, Feb. 6. Rings were presented by Sister Rose Angela, Dean, who spoke to the student body on the significance of the Nazareth ring and the role which they as college women are to take in the modern world.

JUNIOR AND SENIOR students at the college decided upon the design for the ring in the 1927-28 college year. The ring is an amethyst in an antique green gold setting. Around the stone are the words "Signum Collegii Nazareth Roffensis."

On either side of the amethyst on the shank of the ring, the seal of the college is engraved; a wreath of laurel, significant of academic honor, within the circle of which are two books, with an antique lamp thereon, and above the lamp, a Cross. About the up right beam of the Cross are the words "Lumen in Christo," the college motto.

Sister M. Magdalen, S.S.J., chairman of the Art Department, Nazareth College, will be one of the judges at the Scholastic Art Exhibit at Sibley's on Saturday, Feb. 8. Pupils from public and private elementary and secondary schools in the Rochester area submit their work and winners in all classes will have their work on exhibit for the public at dates to be announced.
