

Paratroop Chaplain Makes 100th Jump

Augsburg, Germany — (NC) — Father Joseph A. Natale, a chaplain with the 11th Airborne Division, will soon be given the gold wings and certificate of a century pumper — a parachutist who has made 100 jumps.

The Rochester priest, son of Mrs. Lucy Natale of 97 Brounson Ave., made his 100th jump at the Gablingen drop zone near Augsburg. Father Natale, who has been a chaplain since August, 1950, holds a Master Parachutist Badge, the highest rating a parachutist can receive. He was an assistant at the Church of the Assumption, Fairport.

FATHER NATALE who came into the army in Aug., 1950, qualified as a parachutist at Fort Benning, Ga. in Sept. 1950. While at Fort Benning he received his orders for the 11th Airborne Division at Fort Campbell, Ky. Here he was one of the first jumpers to test the T-10 parachute which was just being introduced to the Airborne Forces, replacing the old World War II type.

From the 11th Airborne Division, Father Natale traveled to the Far East and duty with the 245th Tank Battalion of the 6th Infantry Division on duty in Korea. While in the far east he traveled to Japan and Okinawa. Father Natale spent a total of 11

months of duty prior to returning to the states.

FATHER NATALE then was assigned as Chaplain to the 82nd Airborne Division, Fort Bragg, prior to his assignment to the 11th Airborne, which was then sent to Germany in Feb. 1956, where he is still stationed.

The Chaplain attended Aquinas Institute, Saint Andrew and St. Bernard's Seminaries. He received his training as a Chaplain at

Carlyle Barracks, Pa. and took his airborne course at Fort Bragg.

He holds the United Nation's Medal, Korean Ribbon with three battle stars, Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation, American Defense Medal and Master Parachutist Badge.

Domestic Thrift

Dear Father, "It is getting harder and harder for us to afford property. Money goes through our house so fast the germs on it are sure to get airsick... We have five children... I make about \$4,500 a year... We do have good health... But say, aren't there a few down-to-earth tips that someone body can give us to make ends meet... I am bushed."

The Lord Himself on Judgment Day may ask us, "And what did you see when you were in my world?" Oh, yes! some many answer, "I saw a shining automobile, vitamins, and thick beefsteaks!"

But to be more "down-to-earth" with answers.

A STANDARD of living can be raised 20 per cent by home production. Through a wife's work at home is not mentioned in the national income (unless she works 15 hours a week or more for hard cash), here is the greatest industry in the country. She contributes more than any other single class of worker to the national income. If she can sew, cook, mend, garden, clean, she is an economic treasure.

Only recently the Holy Father praised housekeeping as one of the most dignified jobs known to woman. Earlier, Pius XI had said, "I have a special word of praise for the schools of domestic economy."

A standard of living can be raised another 20 per cent by one who shops wisely. True, Macy's of New York has over 200,000 objects for sale and it would be impossible to know the quality of each, but the big items and the ones a home uses often should be well studied by shoppers.

A shirt doublestitched, does it have pearl buttons? Good buttons are not put on a cheap shirt. The best peaches are often the cheapest; bread may sometimes be a bit cheaper in the store, but does it have home quality? Frozen foods often cost over one-third more than home cooked dishes.

And those gardens! In 1935—a depression year—they produced over \$200,000,000 in products. Those without back yards can often rent a cheap one-half acre on the fringe of the city.

Anyone who doesn't mind working can find innumerable answers to J. M. L.'s question. Sometimes the Government, too, makes us pause and

Catholics Duty To Jews

Show Christ's Love In Action

Providence, R.I. — (NC) — Catholics must make Christ visible in their own lives if they wish to prepare for the day when "Christ's own"—the Jews—will turn to Him and see Him as He is, Father John M. Oesterreicher declared here.

THE PRIEST, a convert from Judaism and director of Judaic-Christian Studies at Seton Hall University, Newark, N.J., said that Catholics pray that the Jews will one day be one with them in the Faith, and because of the New Testament teaches it, we sure that one day it will be so. But the words of our prayers are true only if they are followed by deeds, he said.

CATHOLICS MUST SEE in the Jews and in all men, Father Oesterreicher said, not merely members of a group or persons to whom they attach a label, but men and women created in the image and likeness of God—each one a special word of God in the flesh.

He said that to act otherwise—to distrust others without reason, to dislike them, to be antagonistic toward them, to believe vilifications of them—is to violate the first article of the Creed, belief in God, the Creator of all.

Catholics must see in the Jews as in all men, their neighbors—men and women in need, in search of truth, even though the need and the search might not be obvious, Father Oesterreicher continued. He also stressed the need to see all men outside the Church, and particularly the Jews, as the brothers and sisters of Our Lady.

Belgian Socialist Becomes Convert

BRUGES, Belgium (NC) — A Socialist leader, formerly a Dutch Parliament member and now rector of the European College here, has become a Catholic.

Dr. Hendrick Brugmans, born in Amsterdam in 1912, attributed his conversion to the example of Catholic friends and the understanding of Father Steeman, former chaplain to Catholic students at the European College.

Father Oesterreicher said that in praying for the Jewish people Catholics must "above all remember that Christ, according to His humanity, is the Jew of Jews, the Summit to which all the men of the Old Testament mount."

HE EXPLAINED: "Born of her who is the 'daughter of Sion, all beautiful and sweet,' Christ wore the garment ordered by the Law of Moses, a garment with fringes on its corners and a thread of the sky's blue running through them.

'Christ also spoke the lan-

guage of His people according to the flesh. We can hear it still when the Gospel of the raising of Jairus' daughter is proclaimed in church: 'Talitha cumi, Little maiden, I say to you, rise!'

Christ was very much a part of His people, the priest said. "Must we not be close to the Jewish people too, since Our Lord was so close to them?" Father Oesterreicher asked. He asserted that to love them with a supernatural love is part of the following of Christ.
