Funeral services for Mrs. Mary Kuhn Kuchman, mother of 11 children including two priests of the Rochester Diocese and a Sister of St. Joseph, were held today at 8 p. m. at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church.

Mrs. Kuchman, chosen this year as the outstanding Catholic laywoman by the Catholic War Veterans and Auxiliary, died Saturday, Feb. 8, 1958 before the award could be presented.

'Strange But... False

"Strange... but I think it is false," mused one of the Jesuits at McQuaid Jesuit High School last Friday evening, while he was scanning page four of the Courier-Journal for February 7th. An item in the NCWC weekly cartoon feature "Strange But True" did not look right to him.

Down at the left corner of the feature, superimposed on a sketch of two sheets of paper which represented a letter, was the following notice:

"A letter from St. Edmund Auger (1530-91) to the people of Toulouse to console them in distress of civil war was entitled: 'Spiritual Sugar.'" (Underlining added.)

Now Jesuits are brought up on the history of their order, and especially on two single volume histories of it: Rev. Martin Harney, S.J., the Jesuits in History and Rev. T. J. Campbell, S.J., The Jesuits.

Father Campbell devotes a fair amount of space in his book to the career of Edmund Auger, a famous, sixteenth century Jesuit preacher (who was called the "Chrysolom of France"). But nowhere in his book does Campbell ever make mention of Auger's canonization. Nor does Auger's feast day appear in the Jesuit Supplement to the Roman Missal, with the names of the 27 Jesuits who are canonized.

A few minutes of browsing in the Catholic Encyclopedia confirmed the McQuaid Jesuit's doubt. A column of text, authored by the Jesuit historian T. J. Campbell, is devoted to the career of the Jesuit preacher Edmund Auger. There's not a word about Edmund Auger ever being canonized.

That may seem strange, but it's true!
