Six Rochester-bred Jesuits, are among the priests and scholars that have been named to serve in the newly-created Philippine Province of the Society of Jesus.

The Rochester Jesuits, five of whom have been in the Philippine Islands for varying lengths of time, are the Rev. Fathers Leo W. Welch, Richard A. Miller, Frederick J. Kelly and the Messrs. Thomas H. Green, Thomas R. Fitzpatrick and William J. Malley.

THE PHILIPPINE Province, former a Vice-Province attached to the New York Province, was created last week. It contains the Philippine, Caroline and Marshall Islands.

Father Leo W. Welch, the son of Mrs. Patrick F. Welch of 1279 Fairport Rd., Webster, is vice president of Davao College, Davao City, Mindanao. He teaches theology and physics at the school.

Father Richard A. Miller, the son of Mr. and Mrs. William F. Miller of 179 Augustine St., is connected with the Manila Observatory in Baguio City, Luzon, in the study of astronomy and cosmology. He has two brothers who are Basilian Fathers. They are the Revs. Thomas M. Miller, C.S.B., who teaches history at Aquinas Institute, Rochester, and the Rev. Robert G. Miller, C.S.B., who is dean of men at Assumption College, Windsor, Ontario.

Father Frederick J. Kelly is prefect of discipline at Zambonga College and High School, Zambonga City, Mindanao. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. John F. Kelly of 2270 Maritoll Rd., Greece. He also is director of athletics and the student ROTC at the college.

Mr. Thomas H. Green, S.J., son of Mr. and Mrs. George Green

of 595 Seneca Pkwy., who are members of Sacred Heart Parish, is a teacher of Latin, English and mathematics at Cagayan College, Cagayan City, Mindanao. Stationed there for the last two years, he is also chairman of the Sodality at the college.

Mr. Thomas R. Fitzpatrick, S.J., is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Fitzpatrick of 17 Mulberry St. He has been teaching Latin, English, science and mathematics at Cagayan College for the past three years. He is also director of the college's newspaper, The Crusader and was formerly a member of St. Boniface Parish.

Mr. William J. Malley, S.J., the only one of the six not already there, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. James S. Malley of 466 Hill Ave., members of St. Augustine's Parish. He is studying philosophy at the Jesuits Loyola Seminary, Shrub Oak, N. Y. Upon completion of the course, he will be sent to the Philippine Province. He has a brother, priest, the Rev. James G. Malley, in the Rochester Diocese.

THE LOYOLA Council, made up of relatives and friends of Rochester Jesuits, presented a check for \$100 to the Rev. William T. Wood, S.J., director of the Jesuit Seminary and Mission Bureau and secretary-general of the "Mothers' Guilds," for use in the missions at a council meeting held recently at McQuaid Jesuit High School. Father Wood also addressed the group.

Vienna—(RNS)—Martin Bormann, Jr., 28, son of Hitler's right hand man, will be ordained to the Roman Catholic priesthood here at Easter, Catholic sources disclosed.

Mr. and Mrs. Cosentino were married 25 years ago by the Rev. George T. McCall in St. Mary's Church, Waterloo. They have one daughter, Mrs. Nardozzi, and two grandchildren, Cynthia Ann and Deborah Nardozzi.

On Tuesday morning, Mr. and Mrs. Cosentino and the family attended an anniversary Mass celebrated in the chapel of Immaculate Heart of Mary Seminary, Lockhard Rd.

A buffet lunch was served at the reception in the Cosentino home Tuesday. Silver was used in the decorative scheme. Central feature was an anniversary cake ornamented in silver and topped with a miniature bride and bridegroom.

Mr. and Mrs. Cosentino received a number of gifts of silver and other anniversary gifts.

They said he would probably say his first Mass at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome and later be received in audience by Pope Pius XII.

MR. BORMANN is now completing his studies at the seminary of the Missionary Fathers of the Sacred Heart in Vienna.

He was a member of a Nazi Youth unit at the time of the German defeat and was sent to the Austrian Tyrol where he was befriended by a Catholic farmer named Klaus Hofenwarer. He returned sometime later to Germany, but in 1947 was again in the Tyrol where he was received into the Catholic Church.

THE YOUNG Bormann shortly afterwards entered one of the Austrian provincial seminaries and in 1949 came to Vienna to finish his studies at the Sacred Heart Seminary. In 1950 he went on a Holy Year pilgrimage to Rome and attended one of the mass audiences given by the Pope.

The elder Bormann is generally believed to have died in May, 1945, but there has never been any absolute proof of his death.

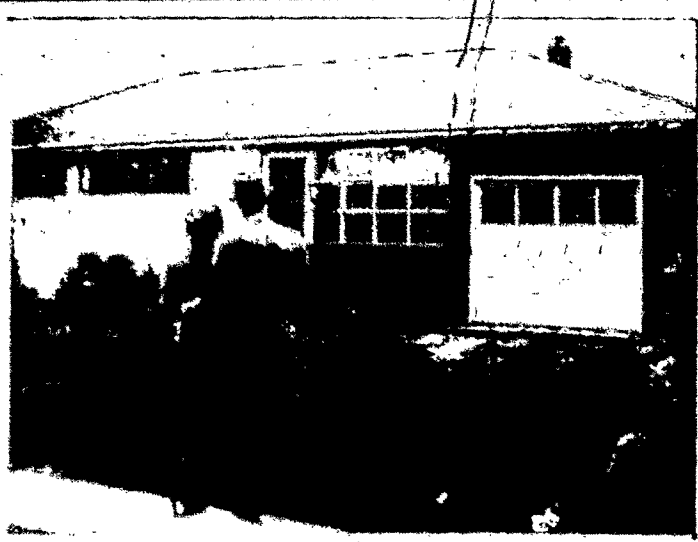
The group will meet at the school in Pittsford at that time, and return for supper at the school at the conclusion of the party.

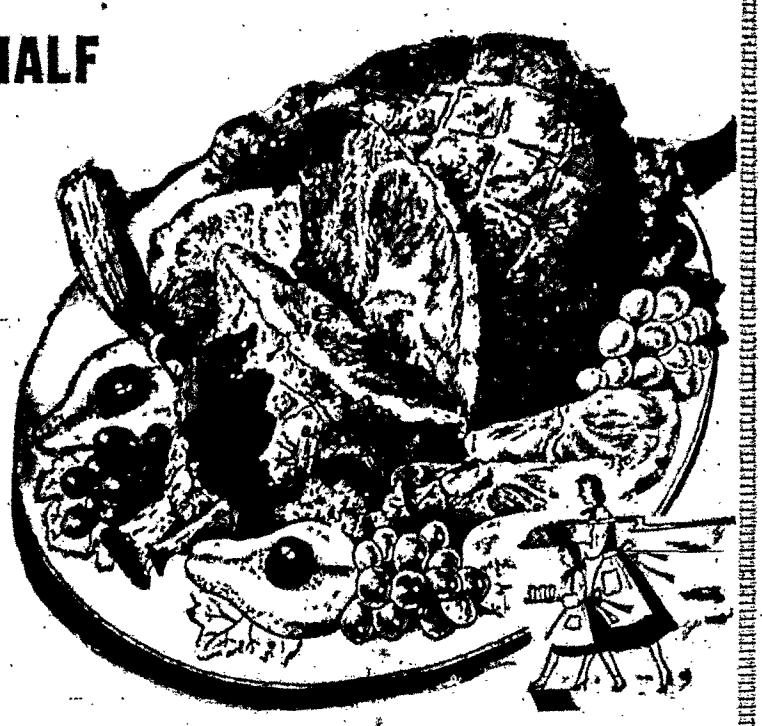
