## Children Admire Wrong Heroes Says Educator

Cincinnati - (NC) - Children's minds are "filled with the wrong kind of heroes," a Catholic educator warned here. He observed: "Ted Kluszewski is honored much more than Jonas Salk."

Dr. Donald B. King, at Mount St. Joseph College, declared that "you cannot persuade youngsters to treat school work seriously if all their heroes are athletes, entertainers and businessmen."

Many of these "heroes." Dr. King admitted, "are very fine people." But he added that "when very little attention is paid to the intellectual heroes of our society, children naturally get the idea that academic work is relatively unimpor-

Calling parents' attitudes toward intellectual achievement the most important single factor in their children's attitudes, Dr. King deplored the practice of "talking more about a child's success on the school teams than his success in school studies.
