

Vatican City-(RNS)-Newborn bables should be baptized as soon as possible, the Sacred Congregation of the Holy Office warned Catholic parents in · statement issued with the approval of Pope Plus XIL.

The Congregation said it was to be deplored that in many cases Baptism is delayed for unjustified reasons.

It reminded Catholics that canon 770 of the Code of Canon Law prescribes as a maiter of "grave obligation" that parents have their children baptized without unnecessary delay.
