St. Louis—(NC)—Free color prints of a painting of the Immaculate Heart of Mary are being offered to viewers and listeners by the Sacred Heart program, it was announced at its headquarters here.

The program, broadcast on some 1,000 radio and television stations throughout the world, is offering the prints to encourage family consecration to the Immaculate Heart during the Lourdes Centennial Year, the announcement said. The original painting is by a well-known religious artist, Florence Kroger.

Consecration of families to the Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart is one of the chief objects of the Sacred Heart program. In 19 years it has distributed some 1.5 million free pictures of the Sacred Heart to its listeners.

Brother Victor (Salas), both killed by Japanese invaders; and several other priests and nuns.

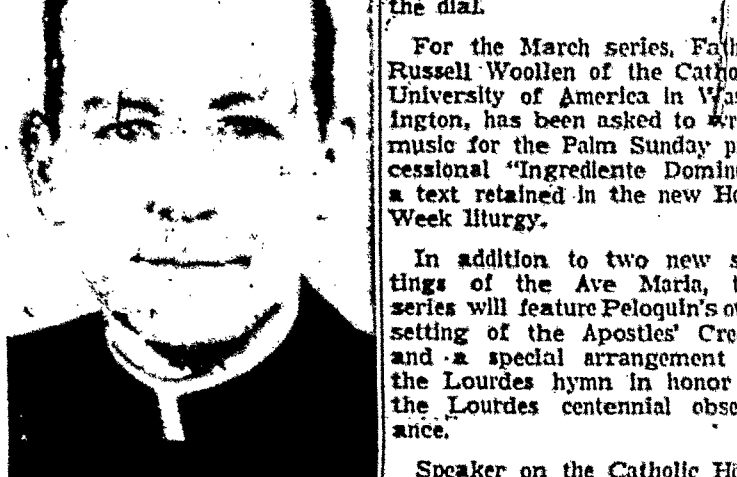


Drama Clinic Preparations

St. Genesius Painting To Be Shown At Clinic

A life-size replica of the patron of actors, St. Genesius, will be part of a display assembled by members of Aquinas Institute Dramatics Club for the third annual Catholic Drama Clinic to be held March 1, at St. Agnes High School.

The full-color picture was painted by Rev. Leonard Cullen, C.S.B., head of the art department at Aquinas. Drawn with bold strokes and dramatic colors the Saint of the theatre is shown holding the comic mask of ancient Rome which is painted a symbolic red to signify his martyrdom.

St. Genesius, an outstanding comedian in Rome in the fourth century was beheaded at the order of the Emperor Diocletian for professing Christianity.

Father Cullen, the priest-artist, has been head of the Aquinas art department since 1951 as well as director of the Aquinas St. Genesius Club.

St. Margaret Teresa, Nazareth College
Realities: Significant Writing from the Catholic Press, ed. by Dan Herr (president, Thomas More Asso.) and Clem Lane (City Ed., Chicago Daily News). Bruce, Feb. 13, '53. 296 pp. \$8.95. A February book-of-the-month of Thomas More Asso. & Catholic Literary Foundation.

"Realities" is a book of compelling proof that American Catholics think that they share generously in the intellectual life of America, that their eyes and hearts are not closed to the problems of their neighbors — and that the ghetto must be removed by their own efforts, that there are still channels to find so that the vital nutriment Catholicism has to offer may enter the body politic.

Each one makes a bid for permanence in the importance of its subject, its conclusions, its firm or lively style.

Some of the authors are familiar mentors: John Courtney Murray, S.J., John Sheerin, C.S.P., Frank O'Malley of Notre Dame, Ralph Gorman, C.P., John Cogley, Most Rev. John Wright, Thomas Murray, formerly of the Atomic Energy Commission. Others less familiar are no less convincing.

And their subjects all count: politics, race, church and state, Catholic psychiatry, Catholic labor, academic freedom, labor unions, sex and marriage, foreign aid — every issue confronting the living citizen.

How does a Southern-born priest, lose his prejudice and actively aid the Negro? Bishop Vincent Waters answers that (Courier, Sept. 21, 1953). How shall Our Lord be represented in art? A "Catholic Messenger" article answers, and though I agree with every single one of the principles of Rev. E. M.
