Geneva Nurses Offer Nursing Scholarship

Geneva — Geneva Chapter of the Rochester Council, National Council of Catholic Nurses announces that another nursing scholarship will be offered this year.

Known as the Bishop Kearney Scholarship it is available to any girl in the Geneva area which is not already served by a chapter of the Catholic Nurses Association.

It provides a full three year scholarship in either of the Diocese's three schools of nursing: St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira; St. Mary's Hospital, Rochester; or St. James Mercy Hospital, Hamilton.

ANY GIRL interested should file a regular application at the school of her choice and take the necessary qualifying examination. She should also write a personal letter of application to the chairman of the scholarship committee, Mrs. Dorothy Buckley, 42 S. Model Street, Geneva.

The committee will meet the first week in May and assess the scholarship on the basis of intelligence, scholastic rating and outstanding qualifications. The committee's decision will be based upon the personal letter of application and recommendations of the directors of the schools of nursing.
