Niagara Alumni Hear Monsignor Kaiser

Msgr. William E. Kaiser, a native of Rochester and overseas member of the National Catholic Welfare Conference, told of the work in foreign lands of the NCWC at the annual election meeting of Rochester chapter of Niagara University National Alumni Association in Our Lady of Victory church Feb. 27.

THE SPEAKER is visiting his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edward W. Kaiser of 441 Eaton Rd., Irondequoit. Attached to the Diocese of Great Falls, Montana, he has spent several years in Germany and soon will leave for a new assignment in Africa.

He told of the scope of NCWC activities around the world and compared it with welfare work of other organizations which are considered better known but who trail the Catholic organization in the matter of money and materials appropriated for aid to the destitute.

The NCWC operates around the world on a budget of about \$6,000,000 which comes from the generosity of Catholics in their contributions on Laetare Sunday, he said.
