Speaker will be the Rev. Edwin Metzger, assistant pastor of Christ the King Church, Kings Highway.

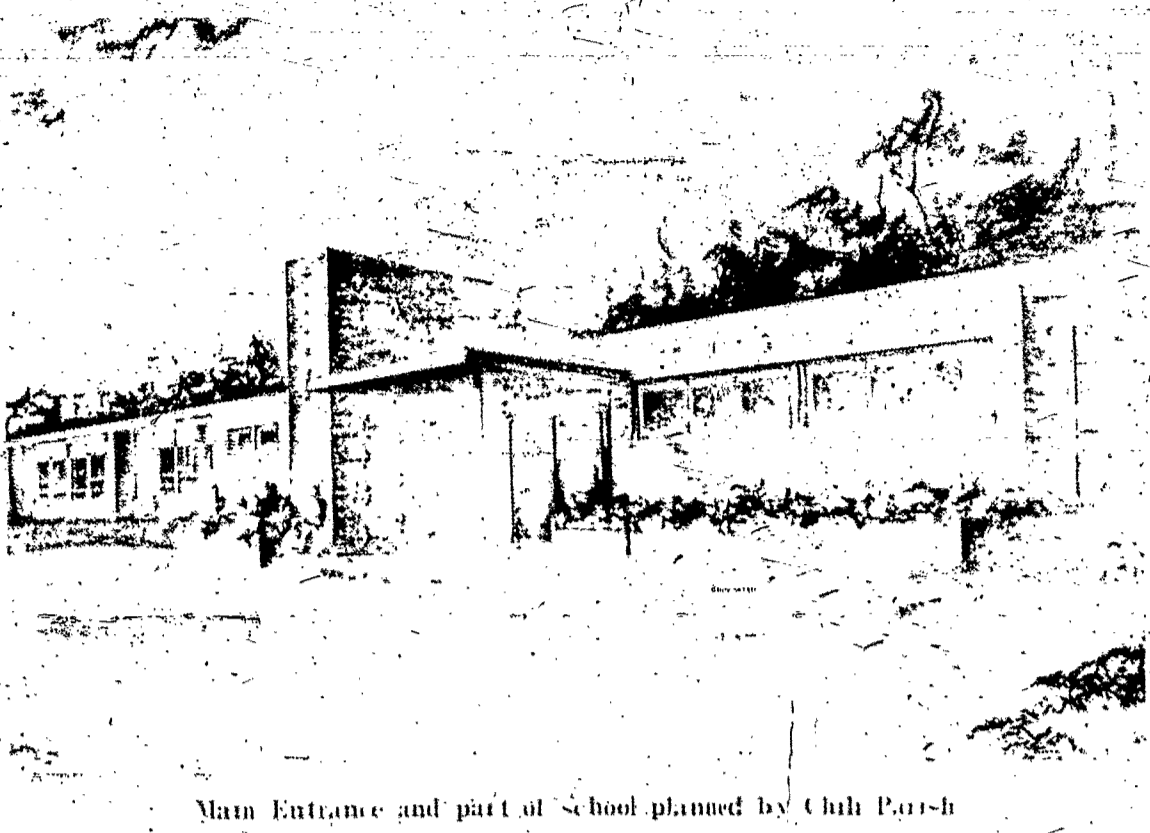
