Father Ringwood Explains Priesthood Preparations

Geneva — "Come follow me and I will make you fishers of men," this quotation from the Bible was used by the Rev. Raymond Ringwood of St. Stephen's Church in a talk on "Vocations" before the Rosary Altar Society.

Members met Wednesday in the school hall following attendance at Rosary and Benediction in the church.

Taking for his subject the vocation to the priesthood, Father Ringwood described the extensive training required preceding ordination.

CANDIDATES spend six years of study in the minor seminaries which includes four years of High School and two years of college under spiritual rule. Students continue on to the major seminary where they have two more years of college and receive a degree. Then they study theology for about four years before being ordained to the priesthood.

After the talk Father Ringwood showed slides which included records and script made by the Seminarians in St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester. The slides were divided into two sections, first dealing with the "Hours of the Priesthood" and the second, "How Does One Become a Priest?"

Mrs. James Walker, president of the society, presided at the meeting.
