

# St. Charles, Sacred Heart Win Basketball Tourney

St. Charles of Greece put on a rally in the last three minutes to defeat defending champions Holy Cross 46-41 in the finals of the annual basketball tournament and was crowned champion in the high school division. Del Smith, led the St. Charles team which was held for most of the game with 11 points and Bobby Lambert had 11 for the losers.

St. Charles reached the finals with a 37-point lead. St. Francis of Assisi, 68-47, and over-preferred favorite St. Monica's, 49-43.

Holy Cross led 12-0 in the first half with hard earned victories over Sacred Heart, 28-26, and St. Apollonia's, 40-36. In the consolation losers bracket, Holy Cross defeated St. Monica's 45-37.

Sacred Heart's comeback in basketball was a roller coaster. After losing out of 20 over the season, Sacred Heart rallied to a victory over Holy Cross in the consolation game. The Holy Family of Auburn won the consolation game in the first championship game. Sacred Heart's only cut out top 32-25. Larry Dever had 11 points for the losers and added 17 in the final.

Sacred Heart Coach, Paddy McFarland, expressed his team as one of the best he has ever coached. In one loss of the season, was to Holy Cross in 1958.

After the championship game all teams, coaches and parents packed the C.Y.O. dining room for an annual awards banquet. Tom Decker, popular WJVF sports director was emcee and introduced Bishop James J. Kearney, the speaker.

**BISHOP KEARNEY** said in part: "I feel that it is a great pleasure for me to be here with you this evening. I wish to express in your presence my appreciation and my admiration of the work that has been done by the C.Y.O. in the past year."

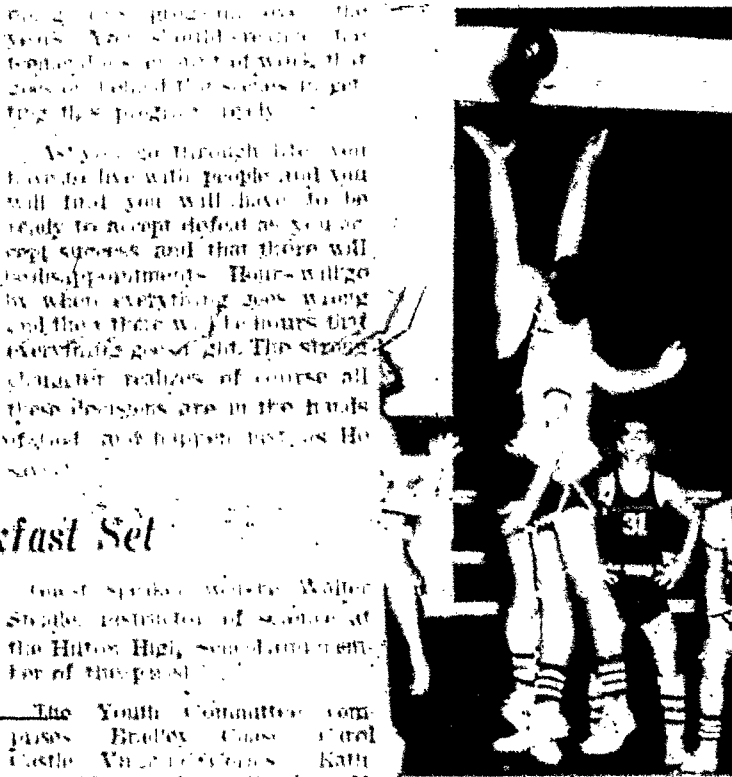
## Hilton Youth Breakfast Set

District deputy William Joslyn has appointed John F. Burke,

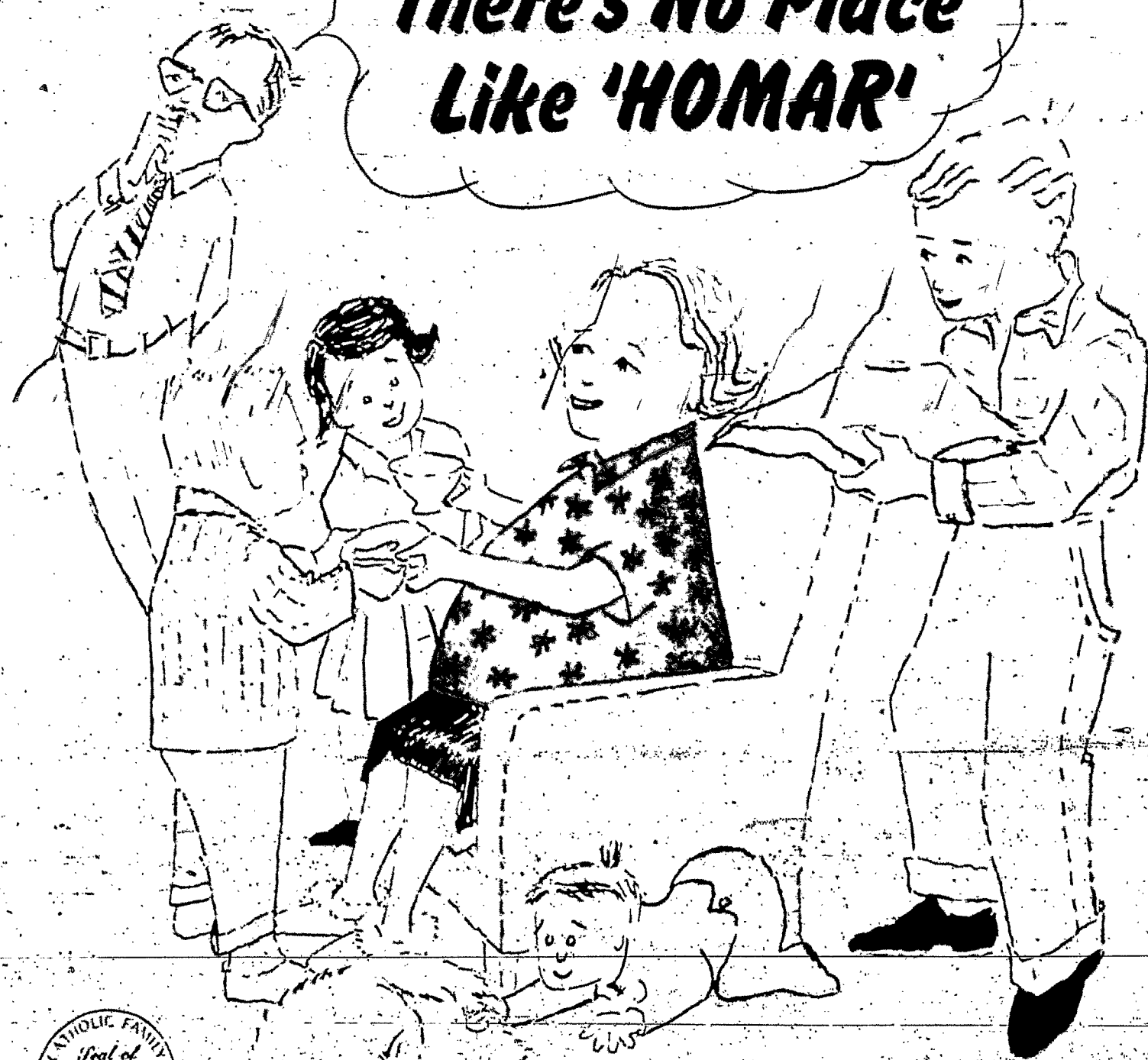

# Catholic Women Hear Father Hogan, List Father Shamón For Next Talk

The second in a series of four lectures of the Institute of the Lay Apostolate, sponsored by the Rochester Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, was presented in the school hall of Corpus Christi Church on Monday, March 10, at 8 p.m.

The Rev. Joseph L. Hogan, S.T.C., of the faculty of St. Bernard's Seminary, spoke on the "Intellectual Formation of the Lay Apostolate." He stressed the need for an enlightened laity, trained in the use of the intellect as "the noblest and greatest of our God-given gifts."

"Christ," he said, "is continued in time and space in His three-fold role as Priest, Prophet and King, in His Mystical Body, the Catholic Church and it is in his personal identification with Christ in this role that the lay apostle comes closest to Our Blessed Lord." Into a civilization which is no longer Christian but in the Catholic should emerge "mature in his faith, articulate in his faith, by word and deed."

many deadening influences on the development of the intellect—namely through movies and TV—the Catholic should be aware of his responsibility to teach himself and others to think intelligently, to increase in secular and spiritual knowledge, to "know God better that he may love God more."

"Christ the Teacher," Father Hogan said, "is developed in us by reading, with emphasis on spiritual reading; by creating a proper home environment; by moderating stultifying influences." Father Hogan pointed out the importance of lay theology courses, study clubs, participation in such vital programs as the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, in developing the intellectual and spiritual life.

A PANEL of three women, Mrs. Theodore Strohmeyer, Mrs. Arthur F. Ennis, and Mrs. Lawrence P. Wells, discussed the practical applications of the intellectual apostolate through the programs of the Council of Catholic Women.

The third lecture of the Institute will be held on Monday, March 24, in Parlor A of the K of C Building, at 8 p.m. The Rev. Albert Shamón will speak on the "Spiritual Formation of the Lay Apostolate" on that date.
