Holy Week Rites Set On TV

The dramatic rites of Holy Week will be featured in a special telecast from Rochester's WROC-TV, Channel 5, this Sunday from 10:30 to 11 a.m.

Produced in France, the film program will show highlights of Catholic Holy Week ceremonies.

Pope Plus XII in 1955 drastically revised and rescheduled the rituals which annually mark the final days of Christ's life on earth and His resurrection on the first Easter.

Most significant of the Pope's changes was his restoration of Holy Communion to the people on Good Friday and placing the Holy Saturday Easter Vigil services close to midnight, its original setting.

Prior to the 1955 revision, only the priest received Communion on Good Friday and the Saturday rite was held early in the morning—customs dating from the late Middle Ages.

Sponsors of Sunday's telecast, the National Council of Catholic Men, urge Catholics to watch the program as a preparation for taking part in the rites in their parish churches.

The Council also presents the program for shut-ins who cannot attend the church rites.

Entertainers Told Not To Advertise Faith

Albany—(RNS)—Catholic entertainers should not advertise their faith, a Franciscan priest said here.

The Rev. Edgar Holden, O.F.M. Conv., professor of theology at St. Anthony-on-Hudson in nearby Bunnell, said it was "no great boon to the Church that we are able to 'see stars' among our numbers."

Referring to a "leading distasteful TV personality as the latest casualty," Father Holden cited an article in a recent issue of a widely-circulated Catholic magazine "which left the reader with the impression that here's a girl just short of a halo."

"While it is not up to us to sit in judgment on the state of a person's soul," Father Holden said, "might it not be better to adopt the wise policy of Mother Church? She canonizes saints only after their death."
