## Father Shamon Cites Challenge To Catholics

Rev. Albert Shamon emphasized the challenge to individual Catholics in the spiritual crisis which grips the world today, at the third meeting of the Institute of the Lay Apostolate held Monday.

FATHER SHAMON, a member of the faculty of St. Andrew's Seminary, pointed out that "this crisis is going to be resolved by two doctrines: the doctrine of the Mystical Body and the doctrine of the Divine Indwelling."

"The dogma of the Mystical Body will enable man to live on terms of friendship with his fellowman; the Divine Indwelling, on terms of friendship with God."

"The interior life—the life of knowing and loving God—is the soul of the lay apostolate, and, therefore, demands the full concentration of the true lay apostolate. In uniting oneself with God, through the development of the interior life, the lay apostle becomes armed with the 'weapons of Christ'—spiritual weapons, the need for which was stated by the Holy Father in his address to the Second World Congress of the Lay Apostolate on October 5, 1957."

MRS. ELMER LORITZ, member of the speakers' bureau of the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, spoke on the various committees of the council—Family Life, Mothers' Circle, and Spiritual Development—whose objectives are the "development of the interior life."

The fourth and final lecture of the institute will be held on March 31, at 8 p.m. in Parlor A of the Columbus Civic Center. Rev. Richard Tormey, chaplain at Our Lady of Mercy High School, will speak on "Public Relations in the Lay Apostolate."
