Funeral services for Francis J. Reddy, a trustee of Holy Rosary Church, Rochester, for 45 years, will be held today, Friday, March 21, at Farrell Brothers Funeral Home, 51 Ridge Rd. West at 8:45 a.m. and with Requiem Mass in Holy Rosary Church at 9:15 a.m.

Mr. Reddy, 82, who devised a calendar he believed would simplify pay roll accounting, died March 17, 1958 at his home, 46 Curtis St.

He was a graduate of Cathedral High School, now Aquinas Institute and a member of the Holy Name Society of Holy Rosary Church. A life-time delegate to the Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union he was known throughout the diocese for work in that organization.

Surviving are four daughters, Miss Alice Reddy, Mrs. John (Virginia) Gilmore, Mrs. Mario (Kathleen) Ferrari and Mrs. Clemence (Gerardine) Neubauer; one son, Thomas F. Reddy; six grandchildren; one sister, Mrs. Thomas Shannon, several nieces and nephews.

Mr. Reddy copyrighted 364-day calendar consisting of 13 months of 28 days each is now before the U. S. House of Representatives calendar committee. He was employed by the city for more than 40 years.

Burial was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Dedicate New St. Patrick's

Bishop Kearney told worshippers at St. Patrick's Church, Macedon, that the new church edifice is, unlike some contemporary churches, "a church of God."

Bishop Kearney, who preached at the Pontifical Low Mass after the dedication ceremony for the new St. Patrick's Church, said that the people of the parish were specially fortunate to have their church completed prior to the celebration of the feast of their Patron Saint, St. Patrick.

"You have a beautiful place in which to pay homage to God and to St. Patrick," Bishop Kearney said.

"I want to pay special tribute to the architect who designed the building and also to Father Hanna and you good people who have made this beautiful church become reality," he added.

Bishop Kearney also said that the portrait of St. Patrick in the Sanctuary was a thing of beauty. He told the congregation the story of the lighting of the first Easter candle in the Emerald Isle.

THE TRADITIONAL lines of the church were also praised by Bishop Kearney as he told the people how much the new church should mean to each one as a place of worship.

Bishop Kearney was escorted by the leaders of the Seventh District, New York State Department, American Legion.
