Single Catholics over 40 are invited. Reservations are being taken at Glenwood 322-02.

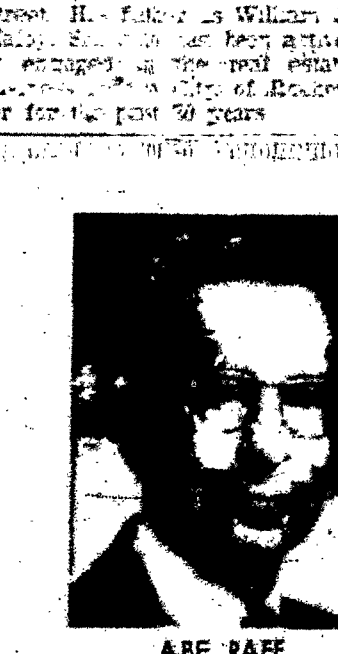
