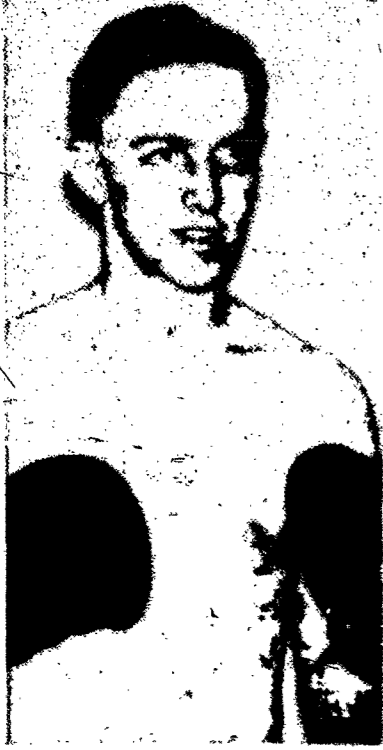


Former Aquinas Champ Seeks Second Title

AN 80-AVERAGE student at the Basillan school, Finger hopes to enter Assumption University in Canada in the Fall.

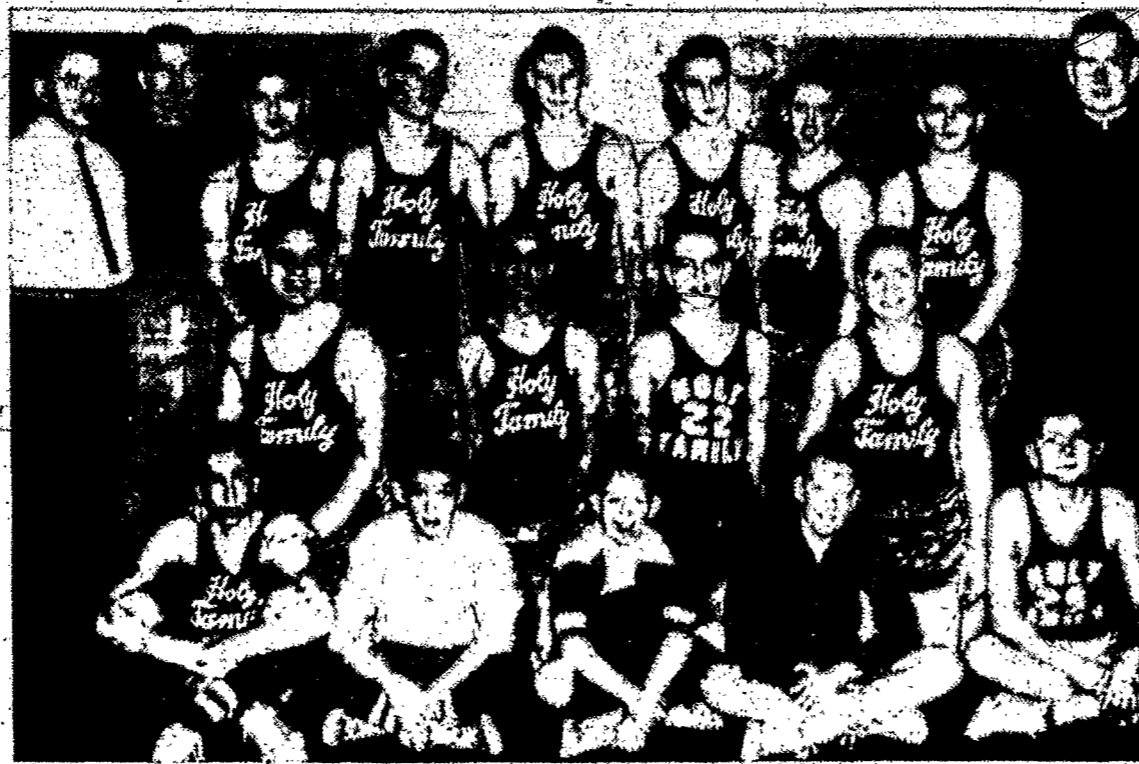
There are still some good seats left for the finals, but persons intending to go should get their tickets early.
