**Three Rochester Schools Cited By Mission Magazine**

Cincinnati — Three Rochester high schools were singled out for their "top-notch mission support" in the March issue of The Shield, official magazine of the Catholic Students' Mission-Crusade (National Center, Cincinnati).  
 The schools are Nazareth Academy, Aquinas Institute and Our Lady of Mercy High School.  
 NAZARETH Academy ended the year 1957 with a staggering total of \$1,760 for the missions, according to the Shield article. In addition to this, the article states, the girls have collected and sent over 200 books to an overseas mission and 30 cartons of clothing and toys to home mission Mississippi, Alabama, North Dakota and New York. Sister Martina Marie is moderator of the Nazareth CSMC unit.  
 AQUINAS Institute was cited in the article for its outstanding spiritual program. Each day a Mission-Mass is held in the school chapel for the mission intentions of the homeroom whose turn it is to assist at Mass. A special Mass is held on First Friday for the intentions of the missions throughout the world and since the Mass begins at 10:30 a.m., under the new fast regulations students may eat breakfast before school and still receive Holy Communion at the Mass. Father John M. Wilson, C.S.B., is moderator of the Aquinas CSMC unit and Father John Ware, C.S.B., is spiritual director.  
 OUR LADY of Mercy's mission program for 1957 was "notable for its far-reaching effects," according to The Shield. With the proceeds from a gigantic two-day mission effort, the CSMCers were able to contribute over \$7,000 to missions and mission aid societies in every corner of the globe.

**Worcester Diocese Gets Kennedy Gift**

Worcester, Mass. — (RNS) — The Roman Catholic Diocese of Worcester has received a gift of \$560,000 from the Joseph P. Kennedy, Jr. Foundation to be used to establish an in-resident school for "exceptional" children and for construction of a recreational center.  
 Of the sum, \$360,000 will be for in-resident school and \$200,000 for the recreation center.  
 The school for "exceptional" children will be erected on the grounds of the Nazareth Home for Boys in suburban Leicester. It will be staffed by the Sisters of Mercy.  
 The foundation was created by Joseph P. Kennedy, former Ambassador to Great Britain. In memory of his son, Joseph P. Kennedy Jr., who was killed in World War II.  
 Mrs. Stephen E. Smith of New York, the former Jean A. Kennedy, presented the gift to Bishop John J. Wright of Worcester.
