

Hibernians Slate Variety Show

The Msgr. John J. Lee Division, Ancient Order of Hibernians will present a variety show on April 13 at 8 p.m. in the Notre Dame High School auditorium, featuring the St. Bonaventure University male chorus and concert band.

The appearance will mark the third annual appearance of the St. Bonaventure group in Elmira and the first under the sponsorship of the Hibernians.

In addition to selections by the 35-voice chorus and the 33-piece band, several solo numbers will highlight the two-hour program. The two groups will be directed by the Rev. Paul J. Ohgny, O.F.M., head of the department of music at St. Bonaventure. He was formerly director of the music department at Siena College.

The Elmira appearance of the troupe will be the last in its tour of New York State. It included programs at Buffalo, Rochester and the Veterans Administration Center at Bath.

Proceeds from the show will be used by the Hibernians for the division's youth work program which includes such projects as its annual essay contest, open to all Chemung County grammar and high school students, and an annual award to an outstanding male student graduating from Notre Dame High School.

President Donald J. Seaman will serve as honorary general chairman. He has appointed Jerome F. Hogan as general chairman and Bernard E. Tighe as program chairman.
