Father Brennan's article was entitled "Library's Reference Books, Digests Declared Useful" is of interest to every Catholic reader. The article follows:

"A library is, of course, a storehouse of books and of similar pointed material. The systematic and orderly arrangement of this material by the library makes it available for readers to use both for profit and for pleasure.

"Whether one reads for recreation or for practical knowledge, the facilities of a library are of ever recurring usefulness.

"For myself, I find our Corning Library most serviceable as a source of reference material. Few individuals can make avail-

able in their own libraries many books of reference being put on the market today.

"The indices, the digests, the almost endless compilations with which our library provides us deserve to be better known and more widely used.

"As a source of reading for recreation, I think the library provides a definite purpose. Many books, especially works of fiction and biography, we read but once.

"The library gives us the opportunity to indulge our taste in this kind of reading with a minimum of inconvenience and cost."
