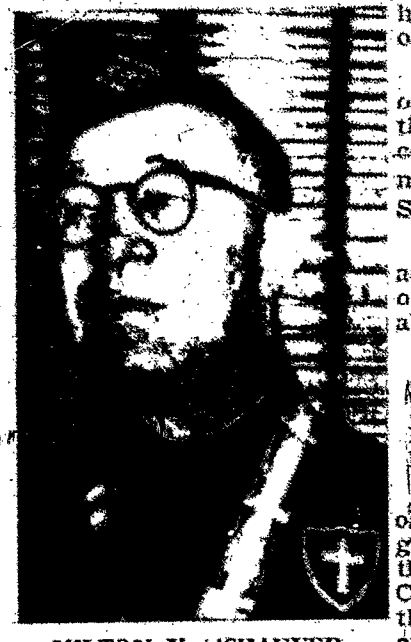

In Scouting 45 Years
Trains Catholic Youth

"Scouting is my life."
Although he didn't say it in so many words, Milton V. Schaefer, 56, of 281 Cypress St. implied it in relating his background in the Scouts.
A BOY SCOUT since he was 11-years-old, Schaefer is the oldest active Catholic Boy Scout lay leader in the country.
He is presently post advisor of Explorer Post 200 at St. Boniface Church, and with Monsignor Joseph Vogt, helped form the first successful Catholic Boy Scout Troop at St. Boniface Church about 28 years ago.
When Schaefer joined the Scouts, there wasn't any restriction as to age, so he was able to become a member of Troop 28, one of the first founded in the city, at 11.
SCHAEFER belonged to Troop 28 until he was 28, rising from Tenderfoot to Eagle Scout and then becoming Scout Master.
It was then that Msgr. (then Father) Vogt, who was connected with the CYO, asked Milt to help him form a troop for Catholic boys at St. Boniface Church.
Although many had tried Catholic troops before, Troop 200 was the first Catholic troop that succeeded. From Troop 200 came almost every other Catholic Boy Scout Troop in Rochester.
AMONG MANY of Milt's achievements was the promoting of Scout Sunday, which he began about 1926.
