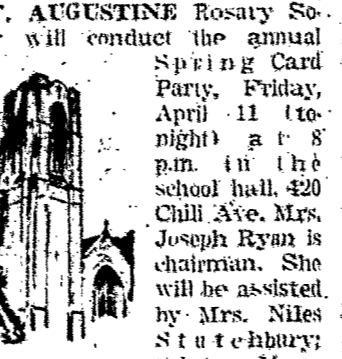

Dr. James P. Fleming, a member of the surgical staff at St. Mary's, Highland and Park Avenue Hospitals, was one of four members of the International College of Surgeons who presented an honorary membership to the college to Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York.

The award was given to the Cardinal yesterday (Thursday) at a private luncheon at the Cardinal's residence on Madison Ave. in New York City.

The college, which has over 14,000 members in 46 countries, presented the degree to Cardinal Spellman for "his outstanding contributions to the medical and surgical world" and "due to the high respect that the members of the medical profession have for him."

Presenting the award with Dr. Fleming, the college's New York State vice regent was Rear Adm. Ross T. McIntyre, executive director of the college. Dr. Horace E. Ayers, regent of the college for New York State, and Dr. John Sauer, a member of the college and a world-renowned figure in eye surgery.

Dr. Fleming, head of surgery at Park Ave. Hospital, is a member of Holy Cross Parish and is the father of five children. He is a graduate of St. Bonaventure University and the University of Bologna. He is a member of the Benventure Club of Rochester and the Third Order of St. Francis.

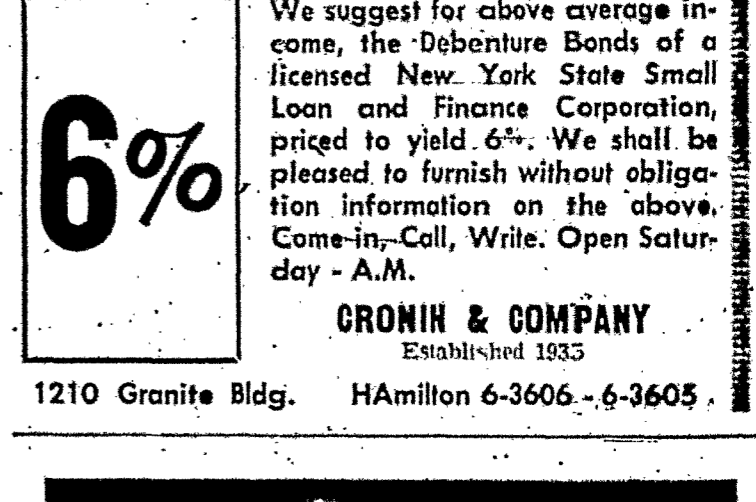
