

Film To Be Released On Life Of Blessed Martin De Porres

Quito, Ecuador — (NC) — A film based on the life of Blessed Martin de Porres will be ready for exhibition in the United States this year, it was announced here.

The film was produced by Dominican Father Norbert Georges, director of the Blessed Martin de Porres Society in the United States. Made in Lima, Peru, the film used many of the actual locations as background for the story of the colored Dominican Brother who was born in Lima near the end of the 16th century.

"Blessed Martin has a special message, especially for colored people, since in certain places Catholics have taken on perhaps too much of a Western and white appearance," Father Georges said, adding: "Aren't colored people entitled to a place in heaven?"

Born of a Spanish father and a freed Negro mother in Lima in 1579, Martin de Porres was apprenticed to a barber-surgeon at the age of 12. Three years later he was admitted to the Dominican convent of the Rosary, where he became a professed Brother. He became known for his skill in caring for the sick. His willingness to perform the most difficult and menial of tasks and his skillful management of material resources made him valuable to the convent. When he died in November, 1639, prelates, state officials and noblemen carried his body to its grave. After many delays, he was beatified in 1837.
