Annual Art Exhibit

Art Students Display Work

The future Rembrandts of Nazareth College's art department will display their creations next weekend.

The exhibit, under the direction of Sister Magdalen, chairman of the college's art department, is done annually to show the work of Nazareth graduates, but will also include the work of some promising undergraduates. It will be shown at the college April 18 thru 20.

Among the exhibitors will be Aljean Lemke, Moya Neville, Carol Skroese and Sister M. Margella Connorton, S.S.J. All four will receive their B.S. degree in Art in June.

In addition to the paintings, the exhibit will also display drawings, crafts, jewelry, ceramics, prints, design, fabrics and sculpture.

THE NAZARETH art students in their four-year college course take not only the theory, philosophy and history of art, but also studio courses providing practical experience and experimentation in all the major art areas.

These include both two and three dimensional design, painting in water color, oil and oil, graphic arts with experience in wood cuts, serigraphy and etching.

Nazareth art graduates are prepared and eligible for New York State certification to teach art on either the elementary, junior high or senior high school level, or to accept positions in the field of commercial art. Nazareth is the only college in the Rochester area which prepares art teachers.

Movies, TV Seen Delinquency Factor

San Francisco - (RNS) A citizens committee appointed by the governor has charged that crime movies, comic books and violent television shows are contributing factors in juvenile delinquency.

The advisory committee submitted a 93-page report to state Attorney General Edmund G. Brown. It cited "the number of hours devoted to serious crime, aggressive behavior and over-emphasis of sex" put on television among the sources of delinquency.

The 50-member committee said "the television industry has a greater obligation to the public to maintain high standards because of its access to millions of homes." The group recommended a legislative investigation of TV crime pictures.

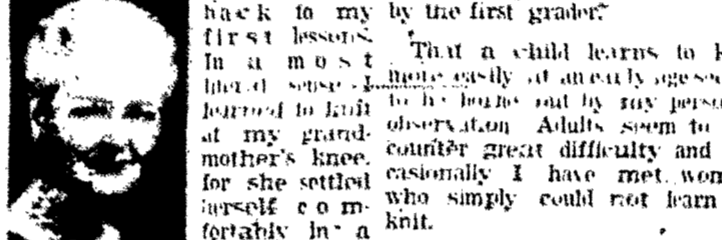

Learning To Knit

As I wrote in last week's column of the importance of teaching girls to knit, my mind traveled back to my first lesson.



My daughter, Madison, in her comradely fashion and put me on a small stool at her feet. In later years, when I have taught little girls to knit, I have found this a most convenient arrangement for the teacher to look directly over the youthful student's shoulder and keep an eye on dropped stitches and other hazards of the work.

In my childhood, the loom was most comfortable for I can still remember how secure I felt leaning back against the long skirts of my grandmother as we worked together. Her grandmother recalled for me her early days in Ireland and the circumstances under which she learned to knit.

IN COUNTY CLARE, she remembered it was customary to teach the young knitter on a pair of pointed and polished goose quills. Then as soon as the art of knitting had been mastered, the youthful knitter was entitled to the tools of the master workman and was presented with a set of steel knitting needles.

Doing a little mental arithmetic and correlating my learning to knit with certain established dates in history, I believe that I learned to knit when I was six or seven years of age.

This would seem to be in keeping with the practice in many European countries. For I recall having heard Elsa Brookfield say that in some parts of France
