

Sister Victorine Mass Offered by Fr. O'Rourke

Requiem High Mass for Sister Mary Victorine, sister of the Rev. Daniel B. O'Rourke, pastor of Our Mother of Sorrows Church, Greece, was offered by her brother in the Sisters of St. Joseph Motherhouse, Puttford, Monday, April 7.

A teacher in schools of the Diocese of Rochester for more than 40 years, Sister Victorine died Thursday, April 3, 1958 in St. Joseph Hospital, Elmira, after a long illness.

In the Sanctuary at the Mass were the Right Reverend Monsignor, Thomas E. Connors, Louis Edelman, and Richard K. Burns.

Besides her brother, Sister is survived by a sister, Mrs. Nora Dursey of Rochester.

Final blessing at the grave in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery was imparted by Father O'Rourke assisted by Father Paul Morgan and Father John S. Duffy.

Father Christopher attended Holy Family School, public grammar schools and Edison Technical High School. After military service with the army he attended the Rochester Business Institute, Gannon College, Erie, Pa., and St. Bonaventure University, receiving his degree from the latter university.

HE WAS INVESTED with the Franciscan habit on Aug. 12, 1952 and professed simple vows on Aug. 13, 1953. After his studies in philosophy at St. Francis College, Rye Beach.

Father Christopher was sent to St. Anthony's Friary, Butler, N. J., to pursue his theological studies. Having professed solemn vows on Aug. 19, 1956 at Christ the King Seminary, Allegany, N. Y., he was assigned to Holy Name College,

Washington, D.C., for the completion of his theological course.

Father Christopher will offer his First Solemn Mass in the Church of the Most Holy Redeemer, 634 Hudson Ave., on May 4th at 12:15 p.m. Rev. Stephen J. Hartdegen, O.F.M., professor of Sacred Scripture at Holy Name College, Washington, D.C., will deliver the sermon. Assisting will be Rev. Sebastian Contegiacomo, C.P.S., archpriest; Rev. Gaudens Mohan, O.F.M., deacon; and Rev. Bernard V. Kuchman, subdeacon. The master of ceremonies is Mr. John Donnelly of New York City. Father Christopher's priestly blessing will be given at a reception in the school auditorium from 4:30 to 7:30 p.m.

The newly ordained priest will visit with his parents while in Rochester, after which he will return to St. Francis Friary in New York City where he will await an assignment to advanced studies in Pastoral Theology.
