According to experts, Nina, little girls, like their mothers, notice everything!

As you say, she has already discussed the subject of preg nancy with her friends and has undoubtedly received considerable information or misinformation by now. This means that you are starting your instructions a little late.

I don't think there's much cause for worry, however, because your little daughter apparently feels free to ask you questions. As long as she keeps coming to you for the right answers, you have no reason to feel concern.

But you want to know when. how much, and how to tell her the things that she ought to know. Since you have other children who must be instructed, and many other couples have raised these same questions, let's start out by stating a few broad principles covering this area of parental instruction.

IN THE CHILD'S early years, parents are regarded as the chief source of knowledge.

The child thinks of parents as people who have all the answers. If they don't answer his routine question concerning sex, his curiosity will be aroused and he'll seek information

Don't project your adult feelings and attitudes into the child's questions.

During the early years, the child asks innumerable, rand o m, superficial questions about everything. If his curlosity isn't specially alerted by your reaction to his questions. he doesn't stay at any one subject very long. Hence, questions should be answered truthfully, but in the broad superficial way they are asked. As someone has remarked, you can tell your children are asking questions that really make sense.

YOUR LITTLE girl is old enough to start asking questions that make sense, and she had best get the answers from

At puberty, however, sex is rerognized as an intimately personal quality. Curlosity and the desire for information are sull operative, but since sex now becomes a highly personal affair, parents should take it for granted that the adolescent also needs the counsel of a spiritual director.

I recognize, Nina, that many parents like yourself seek more than general directives.


