

Nurses Hold Workshop At St. Joseph's

A highlight of the workshop for senior students held on April 24, at the Dunn Memorial, St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, was a fashion show of uniforms during the dinner hour. The show was planned by the Alfred University nursing students who are members of Area 11 of the New York State Student Nurses Association, sponsor of the workshop.

The afternoon and evening program included a keynote talk by Esther M. Thompson, president of the New York State Nurses' Association and dean of the Rochester University School of Nursing; a panel discussion of job opportunities by a group of local nurses representing school-nurse teachers, industrial nurses and office nurses, and a panel discussion of job opportunities in the Armed Forces by representatives of the Army, Navy and Air Force.

Area 11 includes nursing students from St. Joseph's Hospital, Annet Ogden Memorial Hospital, St. James Mary Hospital in Hornell and Alfred University School of Nursing, Shirley Sisolak and Dominica Plutino of St. Joseph's were co-chairmen of the workshop assisted by nursing students from the four schools.

Mrs. Margaret Giles, school-nurse teacher at the Hendy Ave. School, Beatrice Lawton, industrial nurse at Moore Business and Wanda Hamlin, office nurse for Dr. Arthur C. Smith Jr. took part in a panel discussion concerning the qualifications and duties of graduate nurses employed in these types of positions, at the workshop.

Horseheads Parish Kickoff Dinner

Horseheads.—His Excellency, Bishop Casey will address school fund campaigners of St. Mary's parish at a kickoff dinner at 6 p.m. Saturday, Apr. 26, on the eve of a parishwide drive for pledges toward construction of the first parochial school in this area.

Nearly 200 men will attend the dinner, to be held in Horseheads Central High School. Bishop Casey will be presented by Rev. Francis J. Reilly, pastor of St. Mary's Church.

Three-year pledges, with a minimum goal of \$100,000 will be sought in the two-hour house-to-house canvass beginning at 1:30 p.m. Sunday, Apr. 27. Committeemen will attend Benediction in the church before making their calls. Parishioners have been asked to remain at home until contacted by one of the volunteer solicitors.

Nearly 700 children will receive their First Holy Communion during May in Elmira area churches. The schedule is: Saturday, May 3 — St. Mary's, Elmira (165); St. Anthony's, (60); Sunday, May 4 — St. Peter and Pauls, (60); Saturday, May 10 — St. Patrick's, (80); St. Cecilia's (40); Sunday, May 12 — St. Casimir's, (60); St. John the Baptist, Saturday, May 24 — Our Lady of Lourdes, (80); Sunday, June 1 — St. Mary's, Horseheads, (60); St. Charles Borromeo date will be announced next week.

Estimated cost of the structure is \$250,000. Overall plans call for future construction of all parish buildings on the new plot, which adjoins St. Mary's Cemetery.

Father Reilly noted that the proposed auditorium—will be available for Sunday Masses to relieve present and future overcrowded conditions in the small St. Mary's Church.

SERVING AS honorary chairmen of the campaign committee are Father Reilly and Rev. David B. Singerhoff, assistant pastor. Daniel C. Hardman heads the general committee, with Glenn R. Weiland and William J. O'Bryan as vice-chairmen. Advanced gifts are being handled by a group headed by Thomas P. Lynch, William V. Coughlin and Dr. George Schleider. Co-chairmen of the advisory committee are William A. Danaher Sr., James J. Lynch and M. Joseph Danaher.

Included in the parish are the areas of Millport, Pine Valley, Breesport, Veteran, Cullin, Fisherville and most of Big Flats.

Syracuse School Head To Address Elmira

Monsignor James E. Callaghan, diocesan superintendent of schools, Diocese of Syracuse will speak at the Sodality-Altar Society dinner of St. John the Baptist Church, in Langwell Hotel, Elmira, Wednesday, April 30 at 6:30 p.m.

HIS TOPIC will be "The Romance of the Rosary". Born in Oswego, Monsignor Callaghan received his early education there and was graduated from Niagara University in 1932 after which he entered St. Bernard's Seminary and was ordained in June 1936 for the Syracuse Diocese.

He served four years as assistant pastor of St. John the Baptist Church in Elmira and in September 1940 he entered St. Paul's Seminary in Elmira. He received his degree in Sacred Theology from the College of the Sacred Heart in New York City. After receiving his degree he was appointed Diocesan Director of Music and Associate Superintendent of Schools and in 1950 he received his presb. of Schools.

MONSIGNOR CALLAGHAN was made a Domestic Prelate by Pope Pius XII February 1952. "You are destined to follow in the footsteps of our Blessed Mother." His Excellency Bishop Kearney told nearly 300 Ladies of Charity at an affiliation ceremony Sunday afternoon, April 20 in Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Elmira.

The Bishop celebrated the 10th annual Mass of the Elmira group and officiated at the ceremony in which 39 women became Ladies of Charity.

THE BISHOP selected the Lourdes year as his theme. "The Holy Father is urging special devotion to Our Lady of Lourdes,"

he said, "and you are carrying out his desires by selecting this beautiful motto for your ceremony."

"As you kneel here at this proto," the Bishop continued, "you kneel in spirit at the Shrine of Lourdes. Your hearts must be charged with the beauty, filled with the significance of Lourdes."

The Bishop referred to the book, "The Song of Bernadette." "A famous writer, a skeptic, once went to the Shrine of Lourdes. He was not gifted with faith but he was so impressed with the beauty of the faith he saw there, he wrote a book. That book is 'The Song of Bernadette.'"

"THE SONG of Bernadette is a duet. It has the harmony of two great realities—the compassion of Jesus and the tender love of Mary. Your contribution makes a trio."

The Bishop urged the group to emulate the charity of Mary. "The dominating theme of Lourdes is the compassion of Jesus Christ toward suffering mankind, Mary's Immaculate Heart is the channel. As you renew your pledges and take your place in the program of compassionate charity, you are following in the footsteps of Jesus and His Blessed Mother. Pray that you may become a channel of His divine compassion."

The Bishop also addressed the members at a Communion supper served in Our Lady of Lourdes Church hall, following the ceremonies. Frances Battersby, president, presided at the speakers table. She introduced the Rev. Hubert A. Bisky, moderator and Mary E. Fitzgerald, executive director.

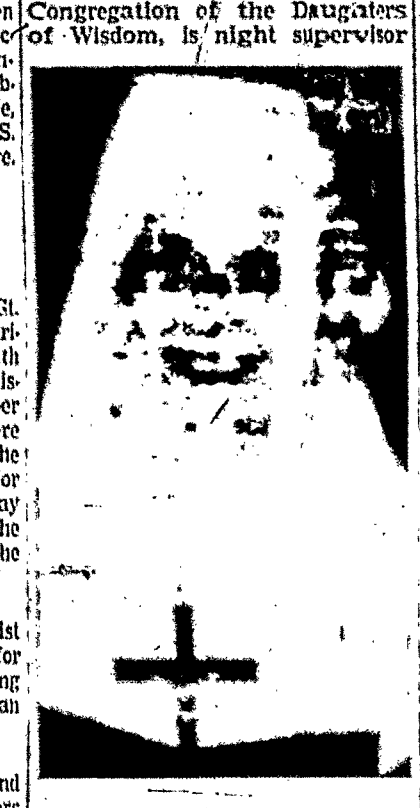
