Nazareth Sets Spring Play

Nazareth College students will present their spring play, "The Boy Friend" on Friday and Saturday, May 2 and 3 at 8:30 p.m. on the East Ave. campus.

The show marks several firsts for Nazareth. It is the first time that the college has presented a Broadway musical, the first time the college has used a professional orchestra in a production and the first time that alumnae have returned to direct a show.

THE PLAY, by Sandy Wilson, had its premiere in London a few years ago and later took New York and the road by storm. It is, in the words of the author, a "spoof" of the 20's, with all its studied carelessness and its stylized actions.

Miss Noreen Carey and Miss Suzanne Wigg, alumnae of Nazareth and co-directors of Rochester's Music Theatre, are working together on the show. Miss Carey is director and Miss Wigg is training the chorus and will conduct the show.

Polly Browne, the heroine, is Kathy Hanlon, a senior music major; Madame Dubbonnet, headmistress of a finishing school for young ladies, is Barbara Finn again, a senior speech major; Catherine Barrett, Mary Lou Brucker, Georgianna Bush, and Patricia Ripple are the "perfect young ladies."

Hortense, a French maid at the school, is Mary Grace Cercola; Lady Brockhurst, mother of the hero, is Jeanne Broder. The show features Melba Nicos, freshman from Puerto Rico, who will dance a tango.

Also included in the cast are Eugene Smith, who plays "no hero"; Peter Kubarycz, Polly's millionaire father; Clement Leavitt, the hero's father; Pat O'Hara, a rich young American; R. A. Barry, Robert Cahill, and Les Carr, who play three French boys interested in the "perfect young ladies."

Tickets for the play are \$1 and will be available at the door.

Lives Of Modern Apostles To Be Shown On TV

New York — (NC) — Four dramas inspired by the lives of modern apostles will be presented on the Catholic Hour television series during the four Sundays of May. It was announced here.

Produced by the National Council of Catholic Men, in cooperation with the National Broadcasting Company, the Catholic Hour programs will be seen on WROC-TV, Channel 5 in Rochester.

"The Victory of Father Karl," scheduled for May 4, is set in the Nazi concentration camp at Dachau. It describes the ordination to the priesthood of Karl Felsner, a prisoner of the Nazis and victim of tuberculosis. The play was adapted by A. J. Palermo from a book by Otto Ples, S.J.

"THE TAR HEEL," by Arthur Cavanaugh, will be presented on May 11. It depicts the struggle of Father Thomas F. Price, whose experiences among the poor in the South led him to establish a missionary society that became known as the Maryknoll Fathers.

The life of Father Charles de Foucauld, noted French apostle, will be the subject of the third drama, "Seeds of the Desert," to be shown on May 18. Father de Foucauld's humble way of life among the Moslems led to the establishment of the Little Brothers and Sisters of Jesus.

TV Topic — Negro Aid To Culture

Washington — (NC) — The contribution of the Negro to American culture will be discussed by Father John La Farge, S.J., on the "Lamp Unto My Feet" television program on April 27. It will be carried on WVEU-TV, Channel 10 in Rochester at 10 a.m.

Father La Farge will be interviewed by Dr. Lyman Bryson.

An editor of America magazine for 25 years, Father La Farge's books include "The Manner is Ordinary" and "The Race Question and the Negro."

Songs on the program will be sung by Odetta, popular spiritual and folk singer.
