AMONG WOMEN English or Grammar

An English teacher at Marquette University is the author of an interesting article in a recent issue of *American Today*. I should like to quote from this in part, and I do so for a variety of reasons, one of which is that it may be helpful to many parents with children of high school and college age in part.

"But the plain truth is that the English teacher is, now, nowadays, a teacher of grammar. In fact, a whole generation of students have grown up and reached college age in an astounding ignorance of the formal grammar of their mother tongue.
"English classes they have indeed had for 12 years; but English teachers, like Martha, have come to be concerned about many things. I won't go so far as to say that they neglect the one thing necessary, but the teaching of English is surely no longer a synonym for the teaching of grammar.
"I AM AWARE that university freshmen in every age have made blunders in English.
"But the great awakening came to me when a single university class in freshman English, made up of people with very good I.Q.'s, preparing for a difficult profession, and otherwise quite well adapted to college work, in a single class exercise turned to such English monstrosities as: 'The book mated him think to much'; 'The play is mad humerus by the author'; 'We use to behave just like wild'; 'She wrang out her bathing suite'; And a prize: 'The reason for the move push asided the other values.' All of these are actual errors and all are culled from one very bad class exercise.
"I stormed and fumed and the youngsters were flunked? No.

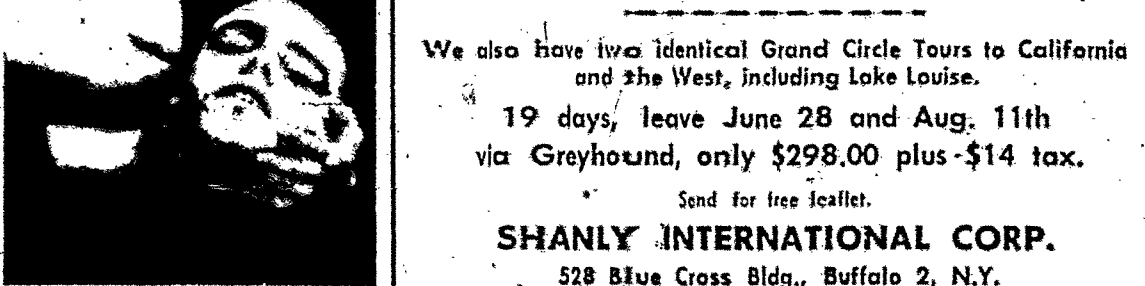
