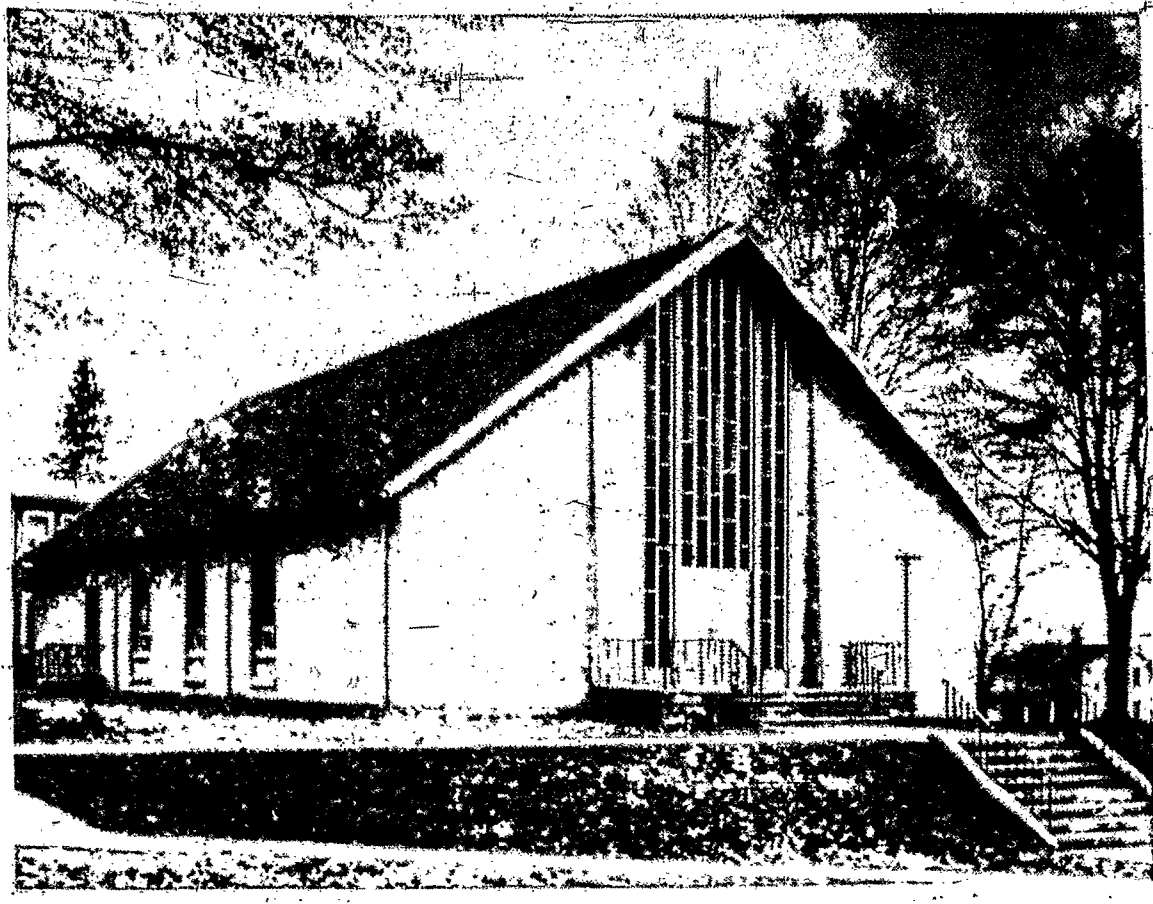

## John Fisher Lets Contract For Building

The contract for the new chemistry building on the St. John Fisher College campus was awarded to the S. P. Vassile and Sons Company, Vassile and Sons were low bidders among nine contractors.

The contract has been assigned as a unit to the general contractor with no independent bidding by the mechanical trades.

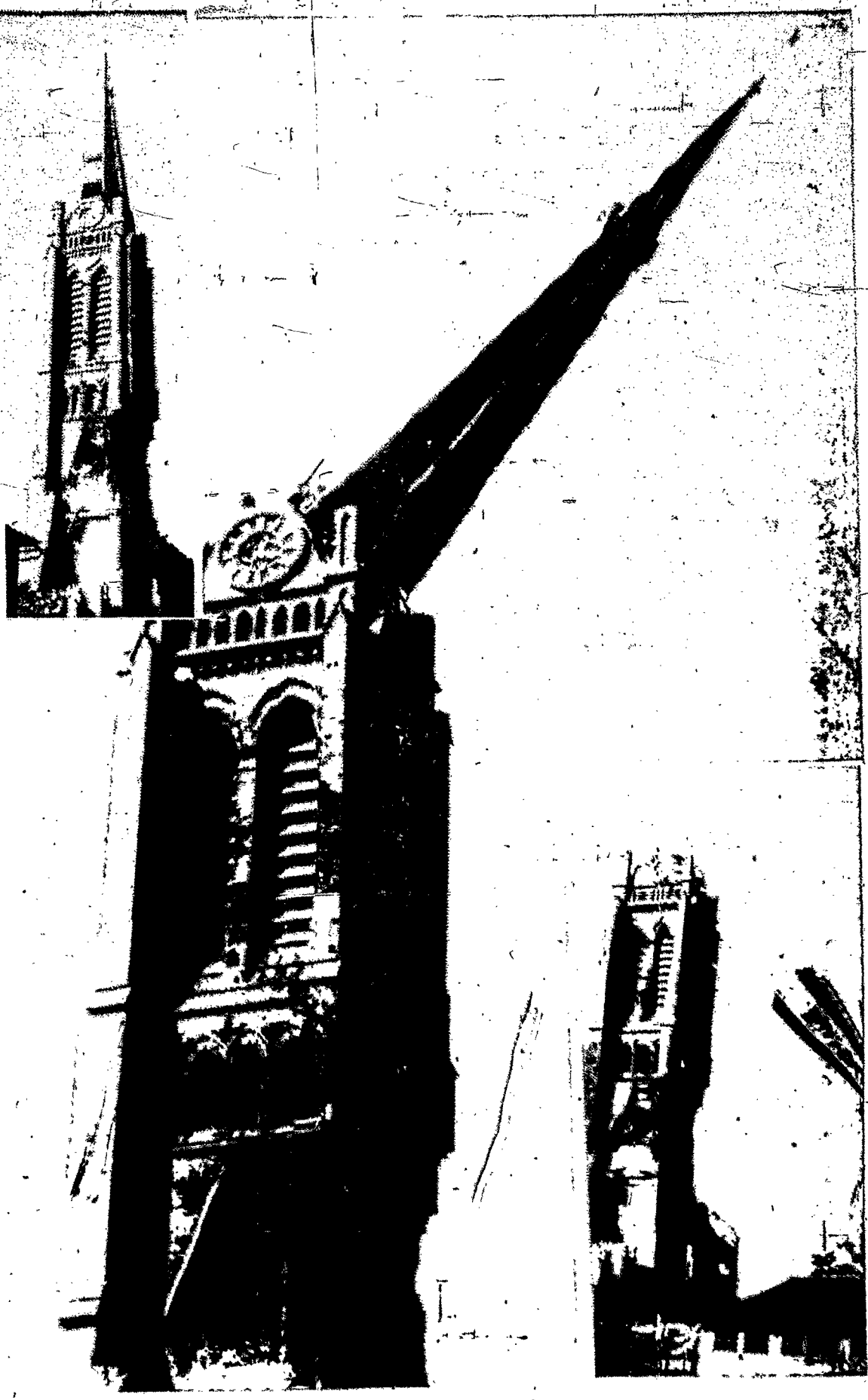
The Vassile company submitted a bid of \$182,659. Work is expected to begin immediately with completion due about five to seven months.

This construction marks the first step in the development of the lower campus at St. John Fisher College. It is the first building of three. A Biology Physics building and gym are to follow the chemistry building.

The chemistry building provides laboratories for general chemistry, analytical chemistry, organic chemistry and physical chemistry. In addition professors' research areas, staff offices, chemistry library and a chemistry lecture auditorium accommodating 138 people are included.
