Langie Stresses Larger Need In Chest-Red Cross Drive

Louis A. Langie, prominent Catholic layman and President of the Rochester Community Chest, has emphasized the fundamental fact that individual gifts to the Drive should be substantially larger than last year to meet the Chest-Red Cross Campaign goal of \$4,178,552.

During a meeting of the Chest directors last week, it was pointed out that agency staffs face higher living costs, that demands for services will increase with the continued population growth and that unemployment will add to case loads and at the same time reduce fees to be collected.

"Care of the aged is one of dominant services provided by a portion of every dollar given in this annual drive," Mr. Langie stated.

"Currently living in Monroe County are approximately 60,000 people over 65 years of age. An interesting statistic in this connection is that metropolitan Rochester per capita population has the greatest number of citizens over 65 years of age of any city in the state of New York, and the 6th greatest per capita population of any city in the na-

tion. In the past year over a quarter of a million days' care have been rendered these senior citizens of Monroe County by the Red Feather Homes for the Aged.

The general drive chairman declared that "Today's social problems concern each and all of us. Your son might be the next to be beaten as he walks home at night. Your grandmother might need infirmity care. Your child might be the one to require physical therapy after an accident."

"If none of these things actually touch you, you are very unusual," he concluded. "Even if they don't, are you willing to turn your back on them? Chances are, they touch someone in your office, factory, church or neighborhood."

A meeting of the board of directors of the Rochester Diocesan Council, National Council of Catholic Women, will take place at the K of C Clubhouse in Geneva, on Sunday, May 4, at 2:30 p.m.

REPRESENTATIVES of nine deanery councils—Monroe County, Coming District, Chemung, Schuyler, Cayuga, Tompkins-Tioga, Steuben, Ontario-Seneca-Yates Livingston and Wayne—will meet to hear reports on the progress of the council's work in the diocese.

Mrs. Theodore Strohmeier, diocesan president, also announced that a delegate to the 29th annual convention of Catholic women will be elected at Sunday's session. The convention is to take place in St. Louis Sept. 20-24. The theme of this convention is "Within the Folds of Her Mantle," honoring the Centenary of Lourdes.

AT THIS MEETING, members of the board of directors will also hear completed plans for the council's third annual Bishop's Tea, in honor of His Excellency, Bishop Kearney.

The tea will be held in Metairie Hall, Nazareth College, on Saturday, May 4, from 2 to 4 p.m. Mrs. Joseph E. Schiorn, chairman, has announced that invitations have been sent to officers of affiliated organizations of the council throughout the diocese.

A topical agency discussion on the various committee programs of the Council will also take place at Sunday's meeting. Rev. E. Leo McManus, spiritual moderator of the council, will address board members at the close of the meeting.
