**Society To Mark
10th Anniversary**

FUND RAISING to refurnish the school convent; a fashion show and card party to establish a scholarship fund; fashion show and dance for the scholarship fund and to provide educational equipment for the school; a masquerade ball and a Thanksgiving bazaar with proceeds going to enlarge the convent; a second Thanksgiving bazaar.

Also, the third Thanksgiving bazaar, with funds raised used to purchase a station wagon for the Sisters. Additional funds, amounting to \$1,000 was given to the Sisters for their convent needs and a check for \$5,000 was given to Msgr. Joseph A. Balcerak, church pastor, for the expansion fund.

Two other money gifts totaling \$3,500 was also given to the church following the society's fourth annual bazaar; \$500 of this went to the Sisters and the remainder to the pastor for the expansion fund. The society also sponsors a Girl Scout troop at the church.

The church will receive vestments made by the Carmelite Nuns on the occasion of the anniversary. The anniversary banquet will be held May 10 in the St. Stanislaus auditorium.
