The ninth biennial convention of the National Council of Catholic Nurses will be held in St. Louis at the Sheraton-Jefferson Hotel from May 15 to May 18. The Rochester Diocesan Council of Catholic Nurses will be represented by eight delegates and spiritual director, Rev. Paul Wohlrab.

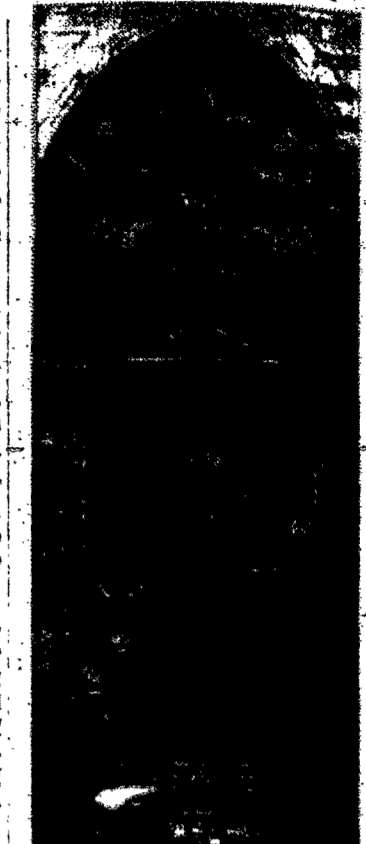
The Rochester Cenacle was established in 1918 on the invitation of Bishop Kearney. The building which houses the community of 14 Religious and the retreat groups of 40 women over each weekend is the former home of Mrs. Nora Conway Todd.

The beautiful residence, which has lent itself easily to its new role and has housed an average of 1500 laywomen and girls each year, will soon be enlarged in order to accommodate the increasing numbers who apply for a place on the closed retreats. A larger Adoration Chapel will also be built, and a convent will be included in the new wing.

The retreats and guild meetings are designed to meet the needs of various groups coming from every walk of life and all ages. In addition to meetings of the six guilds there are catechetical instructions and days of recollection arranged for weekdays.

ROCHESTER CENACLE is one of 35 retreat houses and catechetical centers maintained by the Congregation of Our Lady of the Retreat in the Cenacle the world over.

The motto of the Cenacle "They were all persevering unanimously in prayer with Mary the Mother of Jesus" taken from the Acts of the Apostles, is descriptive of the first retreat made by the Apostles in the Cenacle, or "Upper Room," in Jerusalem and also expresses the spirit of the retreats in all the houses of the Religious of the Cenacle since their foundation by Blessed Thérèse Courderc and Father Stephen
