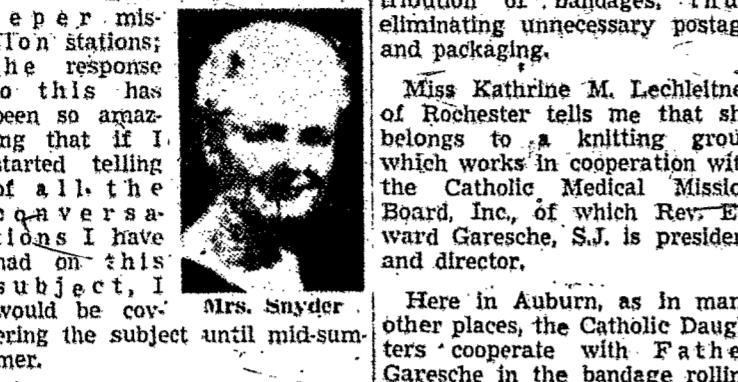

AMONG WOMEN Still Knitting

By Mary Lennon Snyder SEVERAL PEOPLE in Auburn have been banding together and sending a sizeable contribution of bandages, thus eliminating unnecessary postage and packaging.



Miss Kathryn M. Lechleiner of Rochester tells me that she belongs to a knitting group which works in cooperation with the Catholic Medical Mission Board, Inc. of which Rev. Edward Garesche, S.J. is president and director.

Here in Auburn, as in many other places, the Catholic Daughters cooperate with Father Garesche in the bandage rolling project of the mission board.

In writing to Miss Lechleiner concerning the knitted bandages, Father Garesche stated "By all means continue (making the knitted bandages). Send them either to the Catholic Medical Mission Board or to other addresses" which he will furnish on request.

I also have copies of letters Miss Lechleiner has received from Sisters in the cancer missions and I shall pass on some of these to my readers.

"But Miss Lechleiner's own comment was most interesting for she wrote, 'Some of my friends who have had broken hips or similar reasons to spend long sessions in bed and in hospitals say the knitting has been a God-send to them, for the hours drag by, and while working on these bandages they feel they are accomplishing some good.'"

One of the letters comes from St. Francis Leper Village, Bulbula, P. O. Iganga, Uganda, E. Africa. Bandages may be sent there to Mother Annunciata, O.S.F. Mother in her letter to Miss Lechleiner wrote regarding the bandages: "We can never have too many of them, so please go on sending them - they are wonderful."

"So many of our patients have sores on their feet, and we cover their dressings with these nice soft bandages, and it helps them such a lot. They can walk then without too much discomfort, and we have sandals made out of old automobile tires - drivers and garages save them for us - and they go over the bandages."

"ALSO THESE bandages cover dressings on other parts of their bodies. Uganda has nearly 60,000 lepers, and our district has a large number."

"I suppose you were at the Mission Exhibition in Rochester in 1952? I was there, too, in charge of our booth. Came back here that December."

I also have letters from a mission station in the Fiji Islands which Miss Lechleiner received, but we shall save that for a later date. Today we have printed three addresses at both of which the knitted bandages will be most welcome.

Also, I might add that the Rochester groups makes their bandages by casting on 25 stitches and knitting continuously, always slipping the first stitch to get a good edge.
