

# Students Plan Fund Raising

Nazareth Academy's Catholic Students Mission Unit will launch a crusade to raise money for the Convent Building Fund Wednesday, May 14, following the official convent ground breaking ceremony scheduled for 11 a.m.

## State CWV Nazareth College, Academy 'Honor Boy' Featured In 'The Shield'

Robert W. Boykin, a senior at Aquinas Institute has been named New York State "Honor Boy" by the Catholic War Veterans. The award will be conferred May 9th in New York City.

Final selection was based on character, reverence, leadership, scholarship and an essay entitled "My Duty as a Catholic American in the World of Business."

Boykin won the area contest sponsored by the Monroe County Catholic War Veterans. At that time he received \$25 and a chance to enter the state finals. As state winner he will receive \$300 and will be entered in the national finals in Washington, D.C. in June, where the prize is \$1,000.

Boykin, son of Mrs. Agnes Boykin of Chesterton Street, and the late Mr. Boykin, is president of the youth club at St. John's parish, Greece. He is an officer of the Cardinal Newman Library Club at Aquinas and president of the Acolyte, Greek, Latin and French Clubs. He writes for the school newspaper and is active in several school and parish projects.

He is sponsored by the St. Patrick's Post, CWV. He was accompanied to New York City for the state judging by Ralph Blier, Monroe County third vice-commander of the Catholic War Veterans.

## Maryknoll Accepts Philippine Posts

Maryknoll, N.Y. (NC) — The Maryknoll Fathers have agreed to take over seven parishes in an undeveloped area of some 3,200 square miles in the Province of Davao on Mindanao Island in the Philippines.

A mountainous, sparsely settled area, most of the communication between towns and villages on Davao is by sea. The region has exceptionally fertile volcanic soil, and a fine climate. The area has a population of 365,000 (mostly pagan tribes).

CINCINNATI — Two Rochester schools with an international outlook are featured in the May issue of The Shield, national magazine of the Catholic Students' Mission Academy and Nazareth College.

This is the second consecutive time that Nazareth Academy has made headlines in the magazine.

Twelve exchange students representing a cross-section of Europe and one Asiatic country visited Nazareth Academy in February. The report in The Shield reveals the reactions of the visitors to life in an American Catholic high school.

ONE GERMAN guest—a non-Catholic—was impressed with the close connection between worship and education at the academy. This same aspect was noted by a non-Catholic English girl who said, "It was lovely to have this experience seeing how one's religious faith can be carried out in school life." Others remarked on the better discipline, fewer subjects, and shorter day at Nazareth as compared to their schools at home.

A social assembly at Nazareth College for international students in the colleges and universities in and around Rochester is described in the May college editor of The Shield. Foreign students, along with several Rochester lay people interested in the foreign student apostolate, were invited to participate with resident students in a High Mass. After the Mass, a brunch was served for the entire assembly. Notable at the Mass, according to the article, was the universality of the Church encompassing students from every nation.

The international awareness displayed by these Rochester schools is an important part of the CSMC program and will be stressed at the 18th National CSMC Convention to be held Aug. 21-24 at the University of Notre Dame. The general theme of the convention will be "America's vocation to the world apostolate."
