Maryknoll, N.Y. — (NC) — Maybe Macy's doesn't tell Gimbel's, but religious communities apparently do cooperate in the recruiting of vocational prospects.

A recent check of the personnel roster of 766 Maryknoll priests shows that 140 of them have come from Jesuit high schools and colleges and another 30 have come from Christian Brothers schools.

Compiled by Maryknoll Father Robert E. Sheridan, the survey also indicates that many vocations come from public schools. A total of 35 per cent, or 266 of the Maryknollers attended a public school at one time or another.

Lexington, N. C. — (NC) — A group of Protestant workmen gathered here on the feast of St. Joseph the Worker to view their latest handiwork — a Catholic church.

The church, Holy Rosary, is the only Catholic church in this North Carolina city of more than 13,000 population. It was founded here in 1946.

The Protestant workmen were invited to view the church they had built by Father Laurence J. Hill, pastor of Holy Rosary. Father Hill addressed them and pointed out that their model as workers is St. Joseph. The men then attended a dinner prepared for them by parishioners.

Ex-Governor Wills \$140,000 To Catholic Groups

Boston — (NC) — Catholic institutions in Massachusetts and New Hampshire were bequeathed a total of \$140,000 in the will of a non-Catholic former governor of Massachusetts.

The bequests were part of a total of more than a half-million dollars in charitable bequests made in the will of the late Alvan T. Fuller, governor of Massachusetts from 1925 to 1929.

Donations in the will included gifts of \$50,000 each to Boston College, here and Holy Cross College, Worcester, Mass.; \$25,000 to St. Theresa's Church, Rye Beach, N.H., and \$15,000 to Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal Church, Hampden, H.H.
