Missionary, Army Chaplain

Father Erb 25 Years A Priest

A Rochester-born priest who is distinguished as a foreign missionary, Army Chaplain, educator, and organizer will mark his silver anniversary in the Holy Priesthood on Sunday, May 25. He is the Rev. Charles G. Erb, S.V.D.

Father Erb will celebrate his Mass of Thanksgiving in Holy Family Church, Rochester at 11 a.m., May 25. He will be assisted by two nephews, the Rev. Charles Francis Adams, O.F.M. and the Rev. Francis Joseph E. G. Rochester diocese priest, in Elmira.

A breakfast for the immediate family at Plantation Inn, Spencerport will follow the Mass. A reception at Holy Family Hall, corner Jay and Ames Sts., Rochester will be held from 4 to 6 p.m.

FATHER ERB was born August 3, 1906, son of the late William J. and Helen Esse Erb of Rochester. He was the 11th of 11 children.

The jubilarian who is the only religious in his immediate family has three nephews, priests and three nieces, nuns.

They are: Rev. Charles Francis Adams, O.F.M., St. Bonaventure University, Okan; Rev. Francis Erb, of Elmira and Rev. Raymond Quetschenbach, S.V.D., missionary to the Philippines in 1937. Also Sister Helen Marie, S.S.P., Yonkers, missionary nurse, Ghana West Africa; Sister Mary Gerard, R.S.M., Erie, Auburn and Sister Mary Elizabeth, postulant, Mercy Motherhouse, Rochester.

ORDAINED IN 1933 by His Eminence, Cardinal Imtizer at St. Gabriel's, Moedling near Vienna, Austria. Father Erb attended Holy Family School, Rochester, Pa. St. Mary's Divine Word Seminary, Techny, Ill.; St. Gabriel's; Harvard University and University of London, England.

Presently attached to Divine Word Seminary, Girard, Pa. Father Erb has had diversified activity. He was a missionary to Ghana (Gold Coast) West Africa in 1947. While there he served as pastor of Christ the King Church, Accra.

He taught in Mt. Mary Teachers Training College, Senayana, Krobo, and was director of the Accra Catholic Press Bureau and NCWC News Service correspondent for the area. During his stay in Africa he organized Catholic Action and Catholic Youth Organization in the Accra diocese. He was one of the organizers of the first National Eucharistic Congress on the Gold Coast.

Father Erb was exhibit manager of the Mission Scenarium held in Rochester's War Memorial in Oct., 1935 and of the Vikarama in Philadelphia the following year. Since his return to the United States in 1934 he has gone about the country lecturing, conducting retreats and promoting the missions.

DIVINE WORD Society television presentations were produced by Father Erb. With Father "Foto," August Freitag, S.V.D., he turned out Missionaries of Tomorrow, one of the first, if not the first vocation films made in the United States, in 1937. Since then he has produced "The Holy Priesthood," "First Eucharistic Congress in the Gold Coast" and other color-sound 16 mm. films.

As an Army chaplain he served from 1942 to 1946 with the Air Force and Coast Artillery in Alaska and the Aleutians. He

was division artillery chaplain, 42nd Rainbow Division in France, Germany and Austria. He was separated from the service with the rank of major and holds the Bronze Star Medal.

EARLY IN HIS priesthood, 1933 to 1942 he was editor of The Little Missionary, children's magazine. He also edited the so-called Blue Book, directive for SVD minor seminaries. He founded The Shepherd for members of his Future Priests Club, one of the first such vocation clubs in the country.

Other early assignments were prefect of discipline at Society of the Divine Word Seminary in Epworth, Iowa; Techny, Ill. and East Troy, Wisconsin. He also taught English, History, Religion and German at SVD seminaries.
