Bishop Casey To Dedicate Center

Watkins Glen — Dedication of the \$175,000 Catechetical and Social Center in St. Mary of the Lake Parish, Watkins Glen will take place Sunday, May 18. His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey will celebrate Mass at 10 a.m. and bless the new building.

Rev. Benedict Ehmann, pastor of St. Mary of the Lake Church

will assist Bishop Casey at the Mass and in the dedication.

A PRESENTATION Ceremony is planned in the new hall at 7:45 p.m. that day, Father Ehmann announced. Open house will be conducted for friends and parishioners.

Leading roles will be taken in the program by the church trustees. Mayor Mrs. Marcus M. Cass will represent the Watkins Glen community; Children of the parish will present the entertainment.

THE NEW structure comprises a combination gymnasium and hall seating 450 persons. Two large and one small classrooms are included for Catechism classes. A conference and reading room and fully equipped kitchen round out the facilities provided.

The sum of \$100,000 was raised in a campaign last Fall to supplement money on hand to build the center. Leo Conditine was the architect and McLane Construction Co. of Elmira, the general contractor.

The building is on Tenth Street, nearby the entrance of Watkins Glen State Park and closely adjoining the church and rectory on Decatur St.

Catechists Get Diplomas Sunday

Ithaca—His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, will present diplomas to a class of 15 Certified Lay Catechists in the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, in parish hall, Ithaca, on Sunday, May 18, at 2 p.m.

Fourteen of the catechists are parishioners of the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Ithaca, and one is a member of St. John's Parish, Newark Valley.
