**47 Parishes Signed For Religious Vacation Schools**

Forty-seven parishes in the Diocese of Rochester have signed for Religious Vacation Schools conducted under the auspices of the Congregation of Christian Doctrine, according to the Rev. Albert H. Schnack, diocesan director.

Among these are four parishes with their own parochial schools, St. Augustine, and St. Ambrose, Rochester; St. Alphonse, Auburn and St. Ann, Hornell.

**Rochester Woman Leads Career Conference**

Detroit — Thirty young professional women came to the Grail Center here last weekend to ask themselves some searching questions about "service careers." Mariette Wickes, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Wickes of Rochester, head of the Detroit Grail Center, was chairman of the meeting.

These teachers, nurses, social workers and secretaries are coordinating local Grail programs in New York City, Brooklyn, Philadelphia, Chicago, Toronto, Cincinnati, Louisiana, as well as Detroit, into a national effort to link hundreds of professional women who can bring a positive Christian influence to the institutions serving basic human needs.

"HOW CAN we give of ourselves and foster love through service careers? How can we develop creative personal relations with the people we serve? How can we enter into a mutual give and take with co-workers? What is the laywoman's role in Catholic institutions, his contribution in the secular set-up? How can we through job counselling and 'Career Days' help girls decide to enter a service profession?"

These were topics discussed as the group assessed the past year's work and made plans for expanded programs at the local level.

"There is need for communication among women in different professions," said Miss Wickes. "We face many of the same problems, we realize that human needs cannot be separated into airtight categories. We can help each other develop a mature attitude to life—the Christian attitude of giving which a woman needs in order truly to serve others."
