

Ithaca Lay Catechists Receive Certificates

Ithaca — His Excellency Bishop Kearney conferred certificates of graduation to 15 lay catechists at ceremonies at Immaculate Conception Parish, Ithaca on May 18.

The training course for the teachers of religion to Catholic students included 30 hours of methods of teaching religion taught by the Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart, and an additional 30 hours of doctrine taught by the Rev. William Thomas.

THE PROGRAM took place at the parish hall following entertainment by the children of the Religious Education classes. A playlette entitled "Our Mother's Gifts" written by the Sisters was presented.

Graduates were introduced by Rt. Rev. Msgr. William Byrne, pastor.

In his talk, the Bishop congratulated the graduates and stated that:

"Dealing with the type of doctrine taught by our Divine Lord is different from other methods whereby we can use the inductive method of going from what we know to something new; we want to learn, and where we have a program of investigation and research."

"In the matter of Christian Doctrine, where we deal with Divine revelation, we do not come to learn by our own efforts; it is given to us by God. Consequently, it was felt that there was not the necessity for developing the reasons why we believe."

This historical display afforded a quick survey of growth and development of St. Joseph's during the 50 years since the founding in 1908.

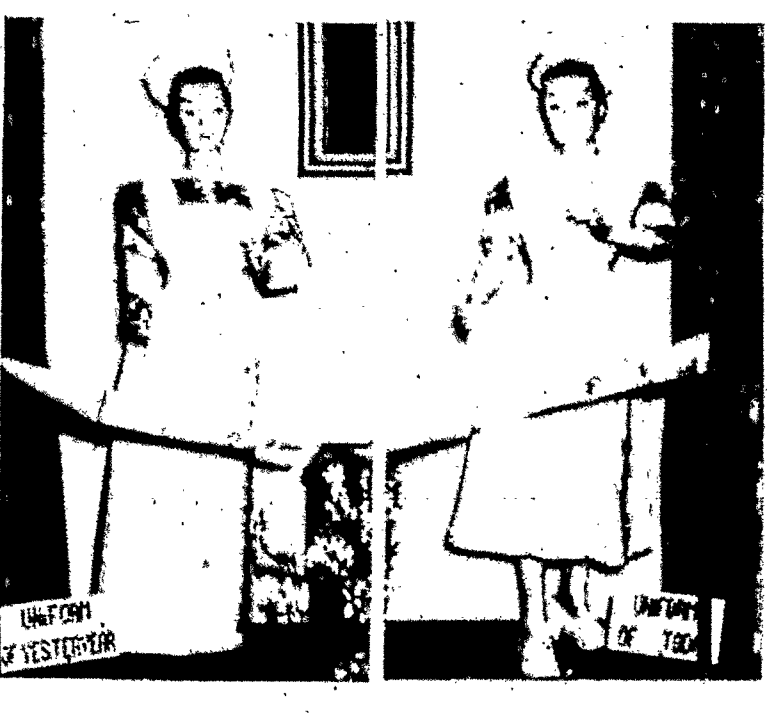
