Wife Follows Converted Jacobite Priest Into Church

Kizhakkambalam, Kerala, India — (NC) — Mrs. Elizabeth Geavarghese has followed her husband, now a Catholic priest, into the Catholic Church, six years after his own conversion.

Mrs. Geavarghese and her husband, Msgr. V. C. Geavarghese, were both members of Kerala's Jacobite Christian community composed of schismatics who broke away from the Church more than 300 years ago.

UPON HIS conversion, in 1952, Msgr. Geavarghese became a priest of the Catholic Syro-Malankare rite, which was established in 1932 for former Jacobites reuniting themselves with the Roman Church.

The Jacobite schismatic church does not forbid married life for priests, except in cases when a priest is to be appointed a bishop. The Catholic Syro-Malankare rite has retained this as well as several other features of the schismatic body.

WHEN A SCHISMATIC priest becomes a Catholic, he usually tries to bring his family into the Church too. In this case, Msgr. Geavarghese was successful. His wife was admitted into the Church by Archbishop Benedictus Mar Gregorius of Trivandrum himself a former schismatic.

At the time of his conversion, Msgr. Geavarghese brought into the Catholic Church the title of "Coptic" which he received while he was a Jacobite. It corresponds to the title of Right Reverend Monsignor in the Latin rite.

Stay Asked On City Sale To Fordham

New York — (RNS) — Opponents of the purchase by Fordham University of two blocks in the Lincoln Square project at less than acquisition cost to the city asked the state Court of Appeals in Albany to stay the relocation and eviction of tenants in the area.

HARRIS L. PRESENT, attorney for two groups of taxpayers opposing the 13-block \$205,000, 000 project, said here he filed the stay motion pending his appeal to the U. S. Supreme Court of the recent unfavorable ruling by the state's highest tribunal. That decision declared the city did not violate constitutional provisions of Church-State separation in condemning and reselling land to the Roman Catholic school at inflated prices.

The attorney said he would carry his appeal to the Supreme Court "within a few weeks." He added "several national organizations," which he said he was not ready to name, planned to support his appeal.

IN ITS DECISION, the Court of Appeals said that Fordham was not getting "a grant or subsidy of public property" in taking the two blocks at a price lower than what the city paid. The court thus rejected the plaintiffs' contention that resale of the area at marked-down prices was a subsidy to the university and contrary to the state constitution.

It said that Fordham did not pay for the actual land and buildings on the property, but for their "reuse value" as fixed by several appraisals. The court's decision also upheld the entire 60-acre slum-clearing project.

Nuns Headdress Cited In Fatal Auto Crash

Mr. Schaefer went out to urge religious communities to take such steps "as may prevent injury and harm to drivers and others."

The accident which took the lives of three Sisters of Mercy of St. Mary's school in Derby, Conn., happened on the Wilbur Cross Parkway near Berlin, Conn.

THE NUNS' STATION wagon sidwiped a truck, went out of control across the center esplanade, struck another truck and then came off a car.

The Sisters of Mercy have notified the State Motor Vehicle Department that, while they do not plan to make any changes in their habit, members of the community will be told to fasten their belts back from their faces while driving.

He recommended to the State Commissioner of Motor Vehicles that "careful consideration be given to the licensing of persons to drive motor vehicles when the headdress of such operator might interfere with maintaining a proper lookout on the highways."

IN FREEING of criminal blame two other drivers involved in the crash on March 15, the Hartford County coroner said the nun's headdress "obviously placed a limitation on her ability to see laterally."

Knitting Bandages

In answer to the request for instruction for knitting bandages, I shall print them here this week; as soon as time will permit, I shall answer the letters requesting information which have been directed to me at home and at the Courier office.

Mrs. Snyder stitches of Knit-Crosheen on a size 1 or 2 double pointed needle and knit back and forth until entire ball is used up. Some knitters cast on 25 stitches which will produce a slightly wider bandage. It is always wise to slip the first stitch of each row, as this makes a better edge.

Another interesting letter which Miss Lecheltner of Rochester has received from the leper missions comes from a sub-station in the Fiji Islands. In a letter dated Easter Tuesday of this year Sister wrote:

"THANK YOU very much for the box of nicely knitted bandages which I received last week. They are very useful — thick, warm, spongy and stretchy and they look so nice when the doctor comes along to see the patients!

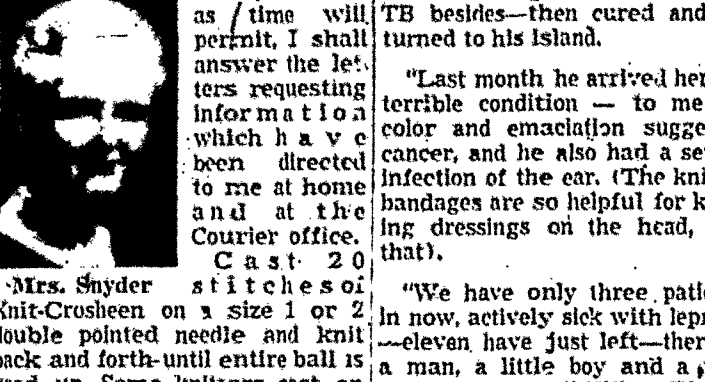
"Our work here at the sub-station is with patients going to the leprosarium, Makogai, and those who are "cured" but because of recurring sores, due to permanent nerve damage, return here again and again for treatment.

"We also have the newly discharged patients who come here to wait for passage on boats or planes to their various islands. Today, we are expecting a group from Makogai—one of the women coming, has been a patient there for thirty years. Just think of the changes she will find when she returns home.

"The warm climate, interesting fruits and vegetables and gorgeous flowers make Fiji a real paradise.

"You may be sure of a grateful remembrance in my prayers every day. May God bless the knitters always."

To which we echo—God bless the missionaries whose love for Him is reflected in their perception of appreciation of His beautiful world, sympathy for His creatures physical sufferings, and a heroic concern for immortal souls.
