Sodality Closed Retreat Set For 30 Area Boys

Thirty boys, sodalists from several parishes of the Rochester Diocese, will spend this weekend making a closed retreat at Camp Columbus, Owego Lake, Auburn, under the direction of the Rev. C. Richard Nangle, assistant pastor of Holy Family Church, Auburn. Father Nangle, formerly assistant diocesan sodality director, has had wide experience in giving retreats.

THIS RETREAT which is being sponsored by the Diocesan Parish Sodality Union came about as a result of the urging of the young men who have been active in our parish Sodality.

For some years the girls have been making their closed retreat at the Canado Retreat House, but the boys did not have the same opportunity for fulfilling this phase of the Sodality Rule which calls for an annual retreat—a closed retreat wherever possible.

The retreat exercises open on Friday evening and will continue through Sunday with closing Benediction and Apostolic Blessing at 2 p.m. Strict silence will be observed.

David Murphy, newly elected president of the Parish Sodality Union, has acted as retreat chairman. He has been assisted by the other officers of the Sodality Union and by representatives in the various churches.

Oblate Missionary Talks At Alma Mater

Rev. Bernard Brown, an Oblate missionary just back from a six month refresher course in Rome for members of his order, was the featured guest at an Aquinas Institute Mission assembly last Friday.

Highlight of his talk to more than 1,200 students was a presentation of a color film made by Father Brown of his Arctic mission. The film depicted the life of an Arctic missionary and included a caribou hunt.

FATHER BROWN spoke of his high school days at Aquinas where he was president of the Mission society. He spoke of his brother, also an Aquinas graduate, who is an Oblate missionary laboring in Brazil.

Dan Shaughnessy, president of the Mission Unit, spoke about the coming CSMC Convention this summer at Notre Dame University.

350 Attend Annual CWV Convention

Nearly 350 delegates and guests attended the annual convention of the New York State Catholic War Veterans last Saturday evening at the Mark Twain Hotel.

His Excellency Bishop Kearney was the guest speaker and spoke on the centenary observance of the apparition of Our Lady at Lourdes.

Charles L. Shelley of Brooklyn was elected New York State Commander and Miss Josephine DiPietra was elected president of the Ladies Auxiliary. Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph Koch of Brooklyn was appointed department chaplain.

THE BISHOP related how Franz Werfel, author of the book, "The Song of Bernadette" had fled German occupied Paris and sought refuge in Lourdes with thousands of others and how he became fascinated as he watched at the Grotto and saw the deep faith of the people and their acceptance of the Will of God.

This scene became a magnet for him and caused him to return many times. The speaker told of the promise made to write the book if he could come to this country.

WERFEL DID get his opportunity to come here and in 1941 the book was written and it was produced as a movie and from this the story of Lourdes was greatly spread throughout the world. The Bishop urged confidence in the intercession of Our Blessed Mother with Her Divine Son and told them to be faithful to the devotion of the Rosary.

The convention closed on Sunday morning with a Mass in St. Patrick's Church. Bishop Kearney was the celebrant.

A framed citation was presented to Bishop Kearney by Commander Shelley at the banquet.

Guests at the affair included Monsignor William J. Brien, V.F., Pastor of St. Patrick Church, Elmira; Monsignor Francis J. Lane, chaplain at Elmira Reformatory; Monsignor Patrick E. Fay of New York; Very Rev. Waldimir B. Dowhovich, pastor of St. Nicholas Ukrainian church, Elmira Heights and several local area clergymen.

The convention for 1959 was awarded to Schenectady.
