Dedication of St. Josaphat's Chapel, 311 Hudson Ave. and of the new St. Nicholas Mission Chapel, 940 Ridge Rd. E. will take place tomorrow, Memorial Day, Friday, May 30.

The blessings will be given by Auxiliary Bishop Ambrose Sheyn, O.S.B.M. of the Byzantine Rite, Apostolic Exarch of Philadelphia.

St. Josaphat Convent houses the Sister Servants of Mary Immaculate who teach in the parish school. The new mission chapel is a converted home where it is planned eventually to erect a church. About 128 persons can be accommodated according to the Rev. Nicholas Wolensky, pastor of St. Josaphat's in charge of the mission.

Masses will be celebrated each Sunday for persons in the area, the pastor said.

Bishop Kearney Speaks At Knights Banquet

More than 400 delegates and guests attended the State banquet of the Knights of Columbus Saturday night in Mark Twain Hotel, Elmira, climaxing the 63rd annual state council convention.

His Excellency Bishop Kearney spoke on the Centenary observance of Our Lady of Lourdes and cited the Knights for their outstanding effort in paying tribute to Our Blessed Mother by contributions to provide the Knights' Tower for the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington.

The Bishop also extended good wishes of His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, state chaplain who was unable to attend the convention.

Bishop James J. Navagh of Cogensburg in the main address urged individual Knights' action in battles for God and country.

TO ACCOMPLISH such an achievement, Bishop Navagh cited Papeal Encyclicals and pronouncements in the field of social action, regarding relation between capital and labor, he urged study of the Encyclicals of the Popes.

"If you search for a solution to the problem of education, what is it that is its aim, its purpose, how true education is to be brought to the human race, the answer is look to the Encyclicals of the Popes," the Bishop said.

"IF YOU WANT to know what professional men should do, what should be done in the field of medicine, in the sciences, in the arts, in every field of human activity—the answer is look to the pronouncements and Encyclicals of the Popes."

Bishop Navagh advised: "Why shouldn't each council list the various needs of society as you will see them in your own community, and then turn to the pronouncements of the Holy Fathers, discover the solution and apply it. Why should not the Knights of Columbus be a part of the spearhead of the Church in restoring all things in Christ?"

State Deputy Emmet Burke told of the expanded program adopted and in the making for youth of the Empire State, including scholarships and oratorical contest.

Bishop Casey Confirms 516 Adults On Pentecost

Over 500 adults of the Rochester area received the Sacrament of Confirmation in two separate ceremonies, on Pentecost Sunday, May 25.

Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey conferred the Sacrament and gave the sermon at both ceremonies.

In a late afternoon rite at Corpus Christi Church, 285 adults were confirmed. In the evening, an additional 238 were confirmed at Sacred Heart Cathedral.

Both churches were filled to capacity with friends and relatives of those who received Confirmation. Most of those confirmed are converts received into the Catholic Church during the past year.

In his talk, Bishop Casey urged the Confirmation candidates to preserve their Catholic faith through devout prayer and frequent Communion. He urged them to encourage others to investigate the teachings of the Catholic Church.
