Graduates Will Hear Bp. Kearney

The 92 graduates of Nazareth College will attend the Baccalaureate services at the Motherhouse Chapel of the Sisters of Saint Joseph on East Ave. Sunday, June 1, at 11 a.m. His Excellency Bishop Kearney, will be the celebrant of the Solemn Pontifical Mass and will also give the baccalaureate address.

Assistant priest will be Msgr. Charles H. Bogle, Diocesan superintendent of schools. Rev. William H. Shannon, chaplain of Nazareth College, will be the deacon and Rev. Albert H. Schumacher, director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, will be subdeacon.

Deacons of honor will be Rev. Roy B. Morphy and Rev. Paul Cuddy, relatives of members of the graduating class. Master of ceremonies will be Rev. Edward J. McAniff, minor offices of the Mass will be filled by students of St. Andrew's Seminary.

THE SENIORS and members of the Schola will attend the Mass and will march in procession from the college to the chapel. The students will sing "Ave Maria" and "The Mass" by the Schola. Regina Pads, a two-part Mass by Brager will be sung by the members of the graduating class. For the Offertory, "Benedictus" Sir Denis, a three-part motet by Ravanello will be sung a cappella by the graduates.

After the last gospel the graduates will present flowers which will be placed on Our Lady's altar by Bishop Kearney. During the presentation the seniors will sing the Ave Maria by Montani. The recessional will be Ravanello's "Te Deum" celebrant, sung by the students.
