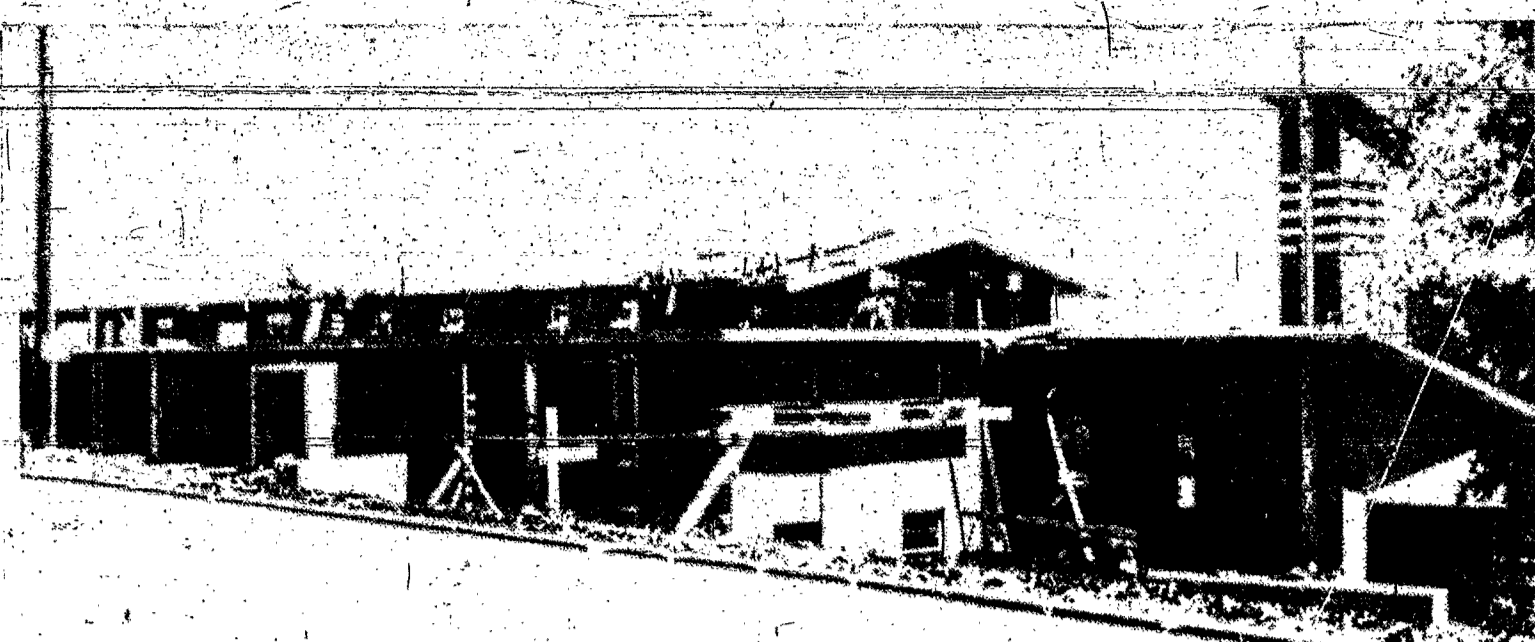

September Public Inspection Eyed for Holy Angels Addition

Public inspection of the monastery and school addition at Holy Angels Home, 1328 Winton Rd., N., is scheduled in September, according to an announcement this week by Mother Mary Immaculate Conception, superior.

Progress toward completion of the two-story building has been proceeding rapidly during the last few weeks, Mother Immaculate Conception reported.

THE HOME provides home and education training for teenage girls in need of special guidance. Thirteen Holy Angels Nuns who staff the home have been living in a 50-year-old farmhouse which was to have been a "temporary convent" when they moved into it 28 years ago.

In a "progress report" being mailed to benefactors and friends of the Home next week, Mother Immaculate Conception points out that to date the Sisters have received \$120,000 in contributions toward the \$300,000 cost of the new building. A total of \$4,500 was turned over to the Home by Holy Angels Guild as a result of its activities for the last 12 months.

THE NEW BUILDING provides much-needed better facilities for both the nuns and the 34 girls under their care. To be added to the north of the present school structure, it will contain 18 cells for nuns; the monastery entrance, parlors, community room, refectory, work rooms and infirmary; quarters for postulants; quarters for a chaplain; a combined chapel, with choir stalls for nuns and pews for the girls; four additional classrooms, a library and a girls' recreation room.

Included on the advisory board of the home are: Monsignors Francis B. Burns, John M. Duffy; Rev. Francis M. Feeney.

Foundation Named For Rochester Born Priest

A charitable foundation, named after the Rev. Nicholas F. Mosier, Catholic chaplain whose home is in Rochester, is being set up at Manteno State Hospital in Illinois to aid in treatment of mental illness.

It is known as the Father Mosier Foundation for the chaplain, who has been at Manteno since 1953. Father Mosier celebrated his first Solemn Mass at St. Augustine Church, Rochester, Feb. 8, 1948.

THE FOUNDATION was officially instituted at a testimonial dinner in Kankakee in honor of Father Mosier.

His mother, Mrs. Mary Mosier and his sister, Mrs. Beatrice Oren, both of Rochester attended the dinner.

Clarence J. Hayden, Manteno attorney who heads the group forming the foundation, said it will function in the areas of mental illness. He said it is now being chartered and a board of directors is being chosen to administer solicitations and gifts to be received by the foundation.

Father Mosier is a graduate of Catholic University, Washington, D.C. He pronounced his first vows in the Marist community in January, 1941.
