Monsignor Edward K. Ball, V.F., pastor of St. Francis de Sales Church in Geneva, and former pastor of Stanley and Rushville, spoke on the Life of a Priest. He concentrated on the Sacraments of the Church, and explained that without the parish priest the people would be denied the graces and benefits of the Sacraments.
