

Mt. Carmel Senior Awards Announced

Auburn—Eighty-one members of the first graduating class received their diplomas from His Excellency, Bishop Journey at the commencement ceremony at Carmel High School, Auburn. Presentation of the graduates was made by the Rev. Brendan Hourihan, O. Carm., principal.

PRESENT FOR the ceremony were Most Rev. Killian E. Lynch, O. Carm., prior general of the Carmelite Order who came from the order's house in Rome for the first graduation; Very Rev. Donald M. O'Callaghan, O. Carm., prior provincial, New York City; Very Rev. Patrick W. Russell, O. Carm., former provincial;

Rev. Charles V. Boyle, diocesan superintendent of schools; Rev. Kieran J. Hickey, O. Carm., New York, who had been active in the preliminary planning of Mt. Carmel; Rev. Mother M. Helen, S.S.J., superior general of the Sisters of St. Joseph in the Diocese of Rochester; Sister M. Florentine, S.S.J., first vice-principal at Mt. Carmel and now assistant superior general; Sister M. Alma, S.S.J., a member of the original faculty at Mt. Carmel and now principal of Nazareth Hall, Rochester.

Father Hourihan announced that Rt. Rev. Msgr. Frederick G. Straub, V.F. dean of the Cayuga Deanery, had sent his blessing to the graduates. Monsignor Straub, pastor of St. Alphonsus Church, has been a patient at Mercy Hospital for the past few weeks following a fall.

BISHOP KEARNEY, in giving the commencement address, spoke in high praise of the school. He reminded his hearers of the contribution made by the Carmelites in the founding of Mt. Carmel in "giving a half million

dollars toward the building of the school and in of its outstanding men to staff it."

Bertie Karpanski was the recipient of the Georgetown award presented by the Georgetown alumni of Auburn for the boy who has displayed steadfast loyalty to the ideals of Mt. Carmel.
