Regains Sight Credits St. Lucy's Intercession

Four years ago, Mary Theresa Mancuso, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Mancuso of 247 Martin St., suffered 90 per cent loss of vision in her left eye.

Then 5-years-old, Mary's loss of sight was due to her contracting measles and pneumonia. Dr. Samuel Ianacone, the family physician, didn't know whether she would get her normal vision back.

Today, Mary has all but four per cent of that vision back and both she and her family credit this to the intercession of St. Lucy, patron of eyesight and the skillful handling of Dr. Ianacone.

"There is no doubt in my mind," Dr. Ianacone said, "that this return of Mary's eyesight is due not only to the Mancuso's diligence in following the medical advice given to them for the care of Mary's eye, but also to the intercession of St. Lucy."

ONE OF THE TOP students at St. Michael School, Mary, naturally will be eternally grateful to both St. Lucy and Dr. Ianacone. She has a picture of St. Lucy in her bedroom and not a day goes by that she doesn't pray to her favorite Saint.

The Mancuso's not only prayed for the intercession of St. Lucy in their daughter's case, but also got all their friends and relatives to join them.

For the first two-and-one-half years, Mary's left eye remained the same. But then, her sight slowly started to return.

With only four per cent still lacking, Mary and her family continue their devotion to St. Lucy, and they hope that soon their prayers will be answered and that Mary will again have 100 per cent vision in her left eye.

ALL THROUGH these four years, Mary has had perfect vision in her right eye. Mary's sister, Patricia, 8, also a student at St. Michael's, has not been affected at all.

Sickness seems to take a particular delight in attacking Mary. This year, for instance, she was out of school for 48 days because of measles (again), a strep throat
