GOD LOVE YOU!

BEING "CATHOLIC" MEANS HAVING a universal love. It would be contrary to the Catholic spirit to assume that we should aid only the Missionaries who come from the United States. It is the Church in the Missions that is to be aided, not a particular nationality. The cause of Christ is broader than race or nationality.

CONSIDER AFRICA. There are 11,199 priests in Africa under the Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith. How many of these priests are from the United States? Only two hundred twenty four or two per cent of the total number of priests. How do we expect the Holy Father to support the twenty million Catholics in Africa and the eleven thousand priests with all their schools, hospitals and leper colonies, if we are going to be nationalistic and limit our support to those who come from the richest country in the world?

SUPPOSE FRANCE SUPPORTED only French missionaries when the Church in America started two hundred years ago? The Irish and the German priests would have starved. As a matter of fact, the Propagation of the Faith of France gave ten million dollars to aid the Church in the United States when we were a "foreign mission" and it did so without any reference to nationality.

THERE SHOULD BE NO DISTINCTIONS made between societies, orders, diocesan clergy; we are all one in Christ. For this reason the Holy Father started his Society for the Propagation of the Faith, to make each nation rise above its national likes and put into his hands all the aims, sacrifices and vocations for the greater glory of God!

WHEN OUR LORD TAUGHT US the Our Father, He did not say: "Give Galilee its daily bread," but "Give us," that is, all humanity. It was a pagan, Terence, who said "Charity begins at home." Our Lord, in the parable of the Good Samaritan said that charity begins away from home. The Jew who passed by the wounded man refused him aid because he was not a "national." While God will bless us for aiding our own, He will not bless us for aiding them exclusively.

New Rector At Conesus Seminary

Very Rev. Paul Burrichter S.V.D. was installed as the new Rector of the Divine Word Seminary at Hemlock Lake, Conesus, on July 1st. Very Rev. Raymond J. Weisenberger, S.V.D., provincial official at the ceremony in the seminary chapel. The new appointment was recently received from the superior general of the Divine Word Missionaries in Rome.

Father Burrichter succeeds Very Rev. Casimir Murawski, S.V.D., Rector at Conesus for the past six years and newly assigned as rector of the Divine Word Seminary at Girard, Pa.

Father Weisenberger who has been re-appointed provincial for a second term of three years, recently returned from a meeting of the general chapter of the society in Rome, which included the election of the new superior general, Very Rev. John Schuetle, S.V.D.

THE NEW RECTOR. Father Burrichter was born in St. Louis, Mo., in 1923. At 14, he entered the preparatory seminary of the Society of the Divine Word at Techny, Ill. He made his college studies at the Divine Word Seminary, Girard, Pa. and then two years' novitiate and major seminary studies at Techny, Ill., where he was ordained to the Priesthood in 1947.

In 1948 his first assignment brought him to the Divine Word Seminary, Island Creek, Mass., as assistant prefect of seminarians. He obtained his masters degree at Catholic University, Washington in 1954. Returning to the Divine Word Seminary, Island Creek, Mass., he was appointed prefect of the seminarians and in 1955 was transferred to the Divine Word Seminary, Conesus, with the triple assignment of dean of the college, assistant rector and prefect of the junior clerics.

Following the expansion of the college and Seminary during the past three years, Father Burrichter now assumes the important position of Rector of the Seminary, which includes the junior college, seminarians' novitiate, brothers' novitiate and brothers' preparatory school.

Rochester-Born Nun Dies In New York City

A native of Rochester, Sister Mary Tryphosa, S.P.S.F., administrator of St. Joseph Hospital for Chest Diseases, Bronx who spent 57 years serving and comforting the sick, to which her order, the Sisters of the Poor of St. Francis, is dedicated died at the hospital, May 26, 1958 according to word received this week.

She was the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. William Sander of Cambell St., the oldest of eight children, and a former parishioner of St. Peter and Paul Church, Rochester.

Born in Rochester, N. Y., July 21, 1879 as Francis C. Sander, Sister Tryphosa entered the Order of the Sisters of the Poor of St. Francis on May 30, 1900 at St. Clare Convent, Cincinnati. She later served as superior of that convent for ten years.

She received her final vows on Dec. 10, 1906. From the year 1918 she had served as superior administrator of St. Anthony Hospital, Columbus, St. Mary Hospital, Quincy, Ill. and St. Anthony Hospital in Queens.

SISTER TRYPHOSA was a full member of the American College of Hospital Administrators, a personal member of the American Hospital Association, and at the any

time of her death was a nominee of the British Royal Society of Health.

Tribute to the noted nun hospital executive began with celebration of Mass by Bishop Joseph F. Flannelly of St. Patrick's Cathedral, Auxiliary of New York and a long friend of the Sister in the convent chapel.

The Solemn Funeral Mass was presided over by Archbishop Paul Yu Pin and celebrated by the Very Rev. Celsus Wheeler, O.F.M., provincial of the Franciscan Friars.

Clergy, nuns, civic officials, doctors and friends thronged the hospital chapel for the Funeral Mass.

Sister Tryphosa celebrated her golden jubilee in 1933. Prior to her recent term as superior and administrator of St. Joseph Hospital, she had served a term in the same position at the Bronx Institution during the 1920s. In 1930 she was chosen to visit the motherhouse in Aachen, Germany.
