Special Line For Each Group

In seeking to curry favor with union labor, communists employ tactics incorporating demands for higher wages, a shorter work week, increased vacations, and controls on living costs. To that end a communist labor union tactician calls for putting "... ideological differences aside in order to work together in behalf of a single immediate objective or a number of immediae objectives . . the unions must work together. ..."

Tactics are also employed by the communists to find favor with Negroes. The controversy on integration has given the United States communists a field day.

Lenin Advises

'Zig-zags'

To achieve the long-range goal, retreats and maneuvers sometimes are necessary, is it not like climbing an unexplored mountain? Lenin asked. How can we "renounce beforehand the idea that at times we might have to go in zig zags, sometimes retracing our stops, sometimes abandoning the course selected and trying various others?" he said.

That explains the communist phrase. "strategic retreat." It means: Don't be afraid to take two steps backward today if it will help to achieve three steps forward tomorrow. Keep the goal always in mind, teach the communists; remember that the enemy is superior in numbers, better armed, more experienced. Communists must be willing to endure hardships.
